WHEREAS, community-based coalitions, developers and local government all play a vital role in addressing the opportunities and challenges of the LRT infrastructure development; and,

WHEREAS, employment, affordable housing, and community and environmental improvements have already been identified in Hamilton as possible positive project outcomes,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That staff be directed to report back to the LRT Sub-Committee on a framework for a Community Benefits Agreement focussing on, but not limited to: affordable housing, employment, local procurement and environmental improvement.
