#### **Council Direction:**

At the February 14, 2017 meeting of the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund Sub-Committee, staff was directed to look at more opportunities to fundraise, in order to replenish the Trust Fund.

#### Information:

The Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund Sub-Committee discussed the possibility of activities to generate income to replenish the trust account. There were different ideas that were brought forward such as promoting and updating the donation card; creating a Donation Wall; and fundraising activities.

#### **Progress**

The Wentworth Lodge donation card was recently updated and now provides enhanced opportunities for the Lodge to fundraise. The previous donation card was primarily geared toward donations in memory of deceased residents. The new donation card instead includes an option to donate to the Lodge "In Honour" of current or former residents of Wentworth Lodge. The Lodge now displays the cards in a more prominent location and have also added the cards to the Palliative Care Carts. These carts are provided at end of life in the room of the resident and offer refreshments for families, information about palliative care and now our donation card to provide Wentworth Lodge as a charitable organization for memorial donations. To date, the Lodge has received \$1,240 through our enhanced donation cards.

A number of Lodge team members have consulted with other Long Term Care Homes to explore additional fundraising activities that have proven to be well received by residents, families, staff and volunteers. All Homes contacted were agreeable that maximizing fundraising revenues can provide important financial support to the Home with the goal of enhancing resident quality of life.

The Homes that were contacted shared a variety of fundraising ideas that ranged from simple activities such as book sales and bazaars to more involved approaches including a Donation Wall, or large events such as a golf tournament. The obvious trend in discussion with other Homes is the move towards fundraising via a robust Home website. Many have elected to set up a donation tab on their website wherein they outline how to donate and to specify items on a donation wish list, not unlike a bridal registry. Homes with the most profitable donation strategies have a designated staff lead focused solely on fundraising and/or a registered Foundation that takes responsibility for generating fundraising revenue.

The legalities of fundraising on site (e.g. Nevada Ticket sales in the Tuck Shop) has been researched with the results indicating a separate Charitable Association must be created to pursue this avenue. Exploration into setting up the Charitable Association has begun. The Lodge placed an advertisement in the Hamilton Spectator in the late spring of 2018 looking for volunteers to develop and lead a Wentworth Lodge Volunteer Association; we received no response to the advertisement. Staff have reached out to some current volunteers and family members to discuss the opportunity, however to date we have been unable to secure a commitment.

#### Next Steps

Lodge leaders will continue to solicit ideas that could enhance our fundraising opportunities from other Homes, Resident Council, Family Council, staff and volunteers. A meeting with our Lodge Leadership in August of 2018 has been set to review the findings of our consultations.

With the near completion of our Courtyard Project we have started to explore the option to incorporate Pathway Markers or Honour Stones with plaques as a fundraising approach. This has proven successful at the Bob Kemp Hospice and we see this as a good fit with the Courtyard Project which has been generously supported through the Heritage Trust Fund.

We intend to consult with Information Technology Web Services and Digital Communications Division at the City of Hamilton to understand the potential to enhance the information about our Home on the City's website. It is hoped that some functionality exists to further enhance the Wentworth Lodge page in order to use the website as a fundraising tool.

#### Information:

In 2012, the Heritage Trust Fund Sub-Committee approved funding (\$100,000) to construct a Gazebo in the Wentworth Lodge Courtyard and it was completed in 2013. This resulted in more residents and families utilizing the Courtyard on a daily basis.

In March 2016, there were 16 Ash trees that were removed from the Wentworth Lodge property (nine of which were located in the Courtyard) due to Emerald Ash Borer disease. This generated discussions from staff, as well as the Resident and Family Councils about replacing the trees in the context of other possible enhancements that could increase our utilization of the Courtyard for recreational programming and special events.

A workgroup comprised of representatives from Resident and Family Councils, along with staff, met and discussed options to improve the Courtyard. This was reviewed with a Landscape Architect, who produced several design proposals. A final design was approved through the Heritage Trust Fund Sub-Committee with an estimated cost of up to \$100,000 in February 2017.

The Wentworth Lodge team proceeded with this project with discussions for increased lighting, shade trees, sidewalk repair, landscaping, pergola and a new fountain to name a few items.

The original plan included the planting of young trees with four inch callipers but this approach was seen as inadequate as the trees would not provide optimal shade within the Courtyard. With the support of the Ward 13 Councillor, mature trees were incorporated into the plan on September 27, 2017.

Due to the changes to the project, the contract was revised through Procurement, with the project beginning in the Spring of 2018.

#### Update

The construction of the Wentworth Lodge Courtyard is now well underway and the official opening celebration has been planned. To date the project has seen the planting of four majestic Autumn Blaze Maples which provide beautiful shade within the Courtyard and the expectation for vibrant red foliage annually in the Fall. Concrete has now been installed surrounding the gazebo and concrete foundations are in place for the fountain and the trellis to be erected shortly. An irrigation system is complete and electrical supports are in place throughout the Courtyard to maximize its functionality for residents and families. Retaining walls are currently being installed as per the design specifications and these walls will also provide additional seating in the Courtyard. The Zen Garden is taking shape with the arrival of river rock and the installation of our Butterfly Garden is imminent. Project timeframes continue to be met and we eagerly anticipate the opening celebration of the Courtyard on September 26, 2018.

#### Information:

The Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund was established to respond to resident needs at Wentworth Lodge that cannot be met through the normal operating and capital budgets. The purpose of this report is to inform committee members of the status of the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund.

On February 13, 2013, an investment strategy for the Heritage Trust Fund was approved whereby \$250,000 of the \$436,000 (without interest) was placed in Guaranteed Investment Certificates (GIC's) that was consistent with the, "Statement of Investment Policy for the Heritage Trust Investment Fund for Wentworth Lodge". At that time, committee members had also committed \$106,000 towards projects (Wentworth Lodge Courtyard Gazebo and Heart and Home Pet Program), which resulted in \$80,000 remaining in the Trust Fund in addition to the GIC's.

The \$250,000 was invested in GIC's in the amounts of \$50,000 over terms of one, two, three, four and five years. The total funds now in the GIC accounts as of July 31, 2018 are \$278,820 as outlined in Appendix A to Report HSC18010(a). The two GIC's that were not renewed from September 2016 have a combined market value of \$110,011 which is paying 1.35% interest. The combined liquid cash is \$110,011 which can be

accessed at any time. The three remaining Fixed Income GIC's have end of term dates from 2018 to 2020, and the average interest is 2.48%.

In addition to the GIC's, there is \$92,097 in the Heritage Trust Operating Account. The available funds that are not committed to GIC's in the Heritage Trust accounts are the \$92,097 in the operating account in addition to the \$110,011 GIC liquid cash for a total of \$202,108. The total Heritage Trust Funds are \$370,917.
