Ontario Traffic Manual Book 7

- Prioritize maintenance of cycling facilities
- Provide early notice, make use of cyclist organizations/groups
- Bicycle specific detours to be used only when conditions cannot be made acceptable or when safer/more convenient
- Provide guidance along detours





Policy Context

City of Hamilton: Temporary Conditions Bike Lanes/Cycle Track

5.10 Temporary Condition

When a roadway with a bicycle facility requires the development of a work zone for construction, maintenance or other temporary activities, **every effort should be made** to minimize disruption to the bicycle facility. This means that closing the bike facility and **requiring cyclists to dismount should be avoided wherever possible**. Cyclists should be encouraged to use general traffic lanes, and motorists should be advised to share the road if a bike facility cannot be **maintained or relocated**.





Impact


The manner in which this project has been pursued will displace hundreds of cycling trips a day, with no clear alternate route. This approach is not in line with the City's stated goal of increasing cycling, with our Vision Zero commitment, or with the recent declaration of a Climate Emergency.



Recommendations







The City of Hamilton bring every construction project that includes or has impact on cycling infrastructure to the Hamilton Cycling Advisory Committee for review with sufficient notice to prepare and share actionable recommendations.



The City of Hamilton conduct public consultations for all projects that impact the safe travel of vulnerable road users, including people who walk and/or bike, with sufficient time to integrate feedback into proposed designs and construction projects.







The City of Hamilton includes onroute accomodations for people who bike in all construction projects whenever safe. On-route accommodations must include a level of protection that is consistent with the original infrastructure, or higher.



When safe on-route accommodations are not possible, develop a safe alternative route, provide any necessary temporary infrastructure, and provide adequate notice to impacted road users through signage and all available channels with due notice.







The City of Hamilton includes funding for accommodations and/or safe alternate routes in every construction project budget, as well as an additional general allocation for temporary cycling projects in the capital budget.

Policy Context: OTM Book 7

2.6.3 Cyclist Safety Considerations

Provide early notice of projects that could cause significant inconvenience to cyclists (e.g., long detours), **making use of cyclist organizations or user groups** where available.

Provide **notification signs for all road users in advance** of temporary conditions, consistent with general practice. Include distance tabs as appropriate.



Policy Context: OTM Book 7

2.6.3.1 Directing Cyclists through the Work Zone:

Where cyclists approach a work zone in a bike lane or designated paved shoulder, it is preferable to maintain those facilities within the work zone, especially if cyclist volumes are high.



Policy Context: OTM Book 7

2.6.3.2 Cyclist Detours around the Work Zone

Detours do not require special signage for cyclists unless it is a bicycle specific detour. Bicycle specific detours should be considered if work zone or motor vehicle detour conditions cannot be made acceptable for cycling, or if a potential detour route for cyclists exists that is safer or more convenient than the detour route for motor vehicles.

Provide advance notice of the detour.

Provide guidance along the detour route.

WHEREAS, the City of Hamilton has approved the Vision Zero Action Plan and the Safe Routes to School Charter;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That Traffic Operations and Maintenance staff be directed to review the designated school zones on King Street East for Bernie Custis Secondary School, on Main Street East for Memorial School and on King Street East and Main Street East for St. Patrick Catholic Elementary School, for the installation of 40 km/hr school zone speed limit with flashing beacons;
- (b) That the installation of the required materials for the installation of 40 km/hr school zone speed limit with flashing beacons on King Street East for Bernie Custis Secondary School, on Main Street East for Memorial School and on King Street East and Main Street East for St. Patrick Catholic Elementary School be completed for the start of the 2019/2020 school year and funded from the Ward 3 Area Rating Reserve 108053 in an amount not to exceed \$90,000;
- (c) That a Type B Pedestrian Crossover (side mounted flasher and overhead signs) be installed on Cannon Street East between Balsam Avenue North and Melrose Avenue North for Bernie Custis Secondary School, to be funded from the Ward 3 Area Rating Reserve 108053 in an amount not to exceed \$60,000; and.
- (d) That the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to execute any required agreement(s) and ancillary documents to install 40 km/hr school zone speed limit with flashing beacons on King Street East for Bernie Custis Secondary School, on Main Street East for Memorial School and on King Street East and Main Street East for St. Patrick Catholic Elementary School and a Type B Pedestrian Crossover on Cannon Street East, with such terms and conditions in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.

Funding for Various Public Infrastructure Initiatives in Ward 3

WHEREAS, Seniors in City Housing at 30 Sanford have reported feeling secure with the use of their key card passes in the lounge and other common areas;

WHEREAS, the Gage Park pump track is open for use by the community and requires investment to provide bicycles and tools for repair to be maintained by the community;

WHEREAS, the completion of the Gage Park Greenhouse necessitates installation of an Access Point which will provide Wi-Fi to the North side of the Park; and,

WHEREAS, Give Proof to Our Youth hosts their annual memorial day and programming on July 27th and will honour the memory of youth who have been killed due to gang violence;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That the funding for the following initiatives, to be financed from the 2019 Ward 3 Area Rating Discretionary Fund (3301909300), be approved:
 - (i) \$15,000 be funded for the installation of a key card entry system to the first floor washrooms at 30 Sanford Avenue South;
 - (ii) \$5,000 be funded to have the Gage Park pump track shed outfitted with tools and a selection of various sizes of bikes for use by the community;
 - (iii) \$1,500 be funded to reinstall the Wi-Fi access point on the new Gage Park Greenhouse; and,
 - (iv) Up to \$1,600 be funded to install a community memorial bench on the south west side of Gage Park;

WHEREAS, a Ward 3 resident has requested the installation of all-way stop control at the intersection of Rosemont Avenue and Barnesdale Drive;

WHEREAS, Transportation Operations and Maintenance recommends that two additional ladder style markings be installed on the east and west crosswalks at the intersection;
