RECOMMENDATION

That the total funds payable from the settlement of the Wentworth Lodge Guaranteed Investment Certificates (GIC) portfolio in the amount of \$287,977, be reinvested in a GIC portfolio under similar terms as previously at one, two, three, four and five years.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund was established to respond to resident needs at Wentworth Lodge that cannot be met through the normal operating and capital budgets. The purpose of this report is to inform committee members of the status of the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund.

On February 13, 2013, an investment strategy for the Heritage Trust Fund was approved whereby \$250,000 of the \$436,000 (without interest) was placed in GICs that was consistent with the "Statement of Investment Policy for the Heritage Trust Investment Fund for Wentworth Lodge".

At that time, committee members had also committed \$106,000 towards projects (Wentworth Lodge Courtyard Gazebo and Heart and Home Pet Program), which resulted in \$80,000 remaining in the Trust Fund in addition to the GICs.

The \$250,000 was invested in GICs in the amounts of \$50,000 over terms of one, two, three, four and five years. The one remaining Fixed Income GIC came due on December 4, 2020, and the average interest was 2.20%. The total funds payable from the settlement of the Wentworth Lodge GIC portfolio was \$287,977.

The total Heritage Trust Funds are \$291,853 which includes the \$3,951 in the operating account and the settlement of Wentworth Lodge GIC portfolio of \$287,977 as outlined in Appendix "A" to Report HSC21020.

Financial: The Wentworth Lodge GIC portfolio came due on December 4, 2020 and was settled in the amount of \$287,977. Staff recommend reinvesting the settlement in a GIC portfolio under similar terms as previously set at one, two, three, four and five years.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

On February 13, 2013, the Investment Strategy for the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund (Report CS13005) was approved.

In 2018, capital payments for the Atrium Courtyard project totalling \$89,766 were used from the available liquid cash from the Heritage Trust Operating Account as approved through Report HSC18009.

INFORMATION

Through generous support of the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund, the main courtyard had significant upgrades completed in 2018. The upgrades included installation of a permanent and large-scale gazebo structure, a decorative fountain and improvements in seating options.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the importance of offering and facilitating safe outdoor recreation and leisure opportunities for residents in Long Term Care (LTC) has been highlighted as an important intervention to minimize risk of infection while addressing overall quality of life.

Despite the recent Lodge's main courtyard upgrades, residents and families have identified several barriers to comfortably and safely use the physical space.

Access and enjoyment of the outside environment has been an area of focus during the COVID-19 pandemic. Residents in LTC Homes across the province suffered and

languished indoors for most of the 15 months of the pandemic due to prescriptive restrictions set out in various provincial directives with the goal of mitigating risk.

As restrictions are being removed and efforts made to return to more normal activities in LTC Homes, the residents and families at Wentworth Lodge have prioritized enhancements to outdoor space and programming as an area for improvement.

Both the Wentworth Lodge Resident Council and the Wentworth Lodge Family Council have had discussions with Lodge staff regarding further enhancements to outdoor areas for resident use.

Specifically, both Councils, have shared an interest in increasing the availability of shade for outdoor visiting through more permanent or effective equipment such as retractable awnings to provide shade for comfort and minimize exposure to ultraviolet radiation from direct sunlight. This need has been identified for both the main courtyard and for the internal courtyard that is used by residents living on the secure neighbourhood due to their cognitive and behavioural diagnoses.

Residents and their families have also referenced an interest in reducing the lawn in the main courtyard and their interest in creating a series of pollinator gardens. These pollinator gardens would support biodiversity and include native wildflower plants that are perennial. The gardens would also serve as focal points in the outdoor environment and support a variety of recreation and leisure programs for residents. Similarly, the installation of an accessible and multifunction shed in the main courtyard has been suggested as a further enhancement.

Preliminary consultation has occurred between the Manager of Facilities at Wentworth Lodge and the Forestry and Horticulture Section of the Environmental Services Division of the Public Works Department to discuss high level opportunities that may exist to support enhancements in the courtyards.

Wentworth Lodge staff will develop a fulsome plan with the required budget breakdown to enhance the two outdoor courtyards and bring it back to the Wentworth Lodge Heritage Trust Fund Sub-Committee for consideration. The plan will be available for review by August 2021.
