## 6. DISCUSSION ITEMS

#### (Hunt/Lukasik)

That the following discussion items, be received.

(i) Waste-Free Ontario Act Updates (Item 8.1)

Staff presented information on the proposed amendments to the producer responsibility regulations for tires, batteries and electrical and electronic equipment made under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016. The Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) is proposing to make these changes which are intended to reflect

market conditions, remove outdated content, and align administrative and technical provisions between the regulations.

Staff provided an update on the Hazardous and Special Products (HSP) Regulation. The producer responsibility program for Hazardous and Special Products is currently in its transition period which ends in December 2022. The City will continue to operate its household hazardous waste depots until the end of the current service contract which expires on September 30, 2022. Staff is planning to share a report with Council by Q2-2022 to provide information on the options on whether the City shall continue to operate the Household Hazardous Waste Depots for the products that are not covered under the HSP Regulation once the contract expires.

## (ii) Operations Update (Item 8.2)

## (a) Waste Collection Service Operations

Staff informed the Committee that the seasonal leaf and yard waste program concluded on December 6, 2021. Leaf and yard waste collection was temporarily reinstated between December 13<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 due to storm events that occurred in mid-December 2021.

Residents can drop-off leaf and yard waste at the City's Community Recycling Centres year-round at no charge.

Curbside collection of Christmas trees is scheduled during the weeks of January 3<sup>rd</sup> and January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

## (b) Waste Processing and Disposal Service Operations

Staff provided information on the City's waste processing service operations:

- 1) Central Composting Facility (CCF) Updates
  - The CCF passed the required annual source testing which models odour impacts in the local environment.
  - The City received approval from the MECP for a temporary increase of 1000 metric tonnes of processing capacity at the CCF to receive organic waste from the City's green bin program.
  - Staff is developing a budget estimate for a project to upgrade the CCF's odour management system.

- 2) Material Recycling Facility (MRF) Updates
  - The MRF will begin accepting merchant cardboard materials in December 2021, which will provide small revenue for the City.
- 3) Transfer Stations/Community Recycling Facilities Updates
  - The Reuse Store at the Mountain Community Recycling Centre re-opened on December 1, 2021.
  - Staff is reviewing the land requirements for the expansion of an additional Transfer Station/Community Recycling Centre.
- 4) Glanbrook Landfill Updates
  - The City will issue a Request for Proposal for the design and construction of Cells C, D and E within stage 3 at Glanbrook Landfill. Construction is expected to begin in Q2-2022.

## (c) Promotion and Education

Staff provided an update on the 2022-2023 Recycling and Waste Calendar. The calendar will include information on the waste management programs such as waste collection safety, reducing contamination in the blue box program, waste reduction tips, and the Provincial Blue Box program changes. The calendar will be mailed in early March. The calendar will include 12 trash tags and residents will be able to request an additional 14 trash tags.

## (d) Solid Waste Collection Design Requirements

Staff reported that the Waste Collection Design Requirements was approved by Council on November 10, 2021. Meetings were held in December 2021 with representatives from the Development Industry and staff in the Planning and Economic Development Department to provide information on the new design requirements.

Staff provided an update that three locations in Ward 2 were reviewed to determine if these sites will be able to comply with the new front-end bin waste diversion program.

Main Street East and King Street East (Delta) In-Service Road Safety Review, Hamilton (Ward 3)

WHEREAS, the City of Hamilton Vision Zero Action Plan 2019-2025 identifies that no loss of life is acceptable, and that traffic fatalities and injuries are preventable;

WHEREAS, ensuring the safety of vulnerable road users is a priority;

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2022 four people lost their lives, including three pedestrians, in a motor vehicle collision on King Street East near the delta intersection;

WHEREAS, Ward 3 residents have expressed safety concerns as pedestrians for this intersection: and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Operations & Maintenance Division is facilitating an inservice road safety review of the Main Street East and King Street East (delta) intersection to identify possible safety enhancements.

### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That upon the conclusion of the Main Street East and King Street East in-service road safety review that the Transportation Operations & Maintenance Division report back to the Public Works Committee with the review's findings inclusive of costs and a proposed implementation plan; and
- (b) That the Main Street East and King Street East in-service road safety review findings be shared with the City's LRT office for consideration and to identify if any of the proposed safety enhancements could be incorporated into the redesign of the intersection.

Main Street West at Dundurn Street South and King Street West at Dundurn Street South Intersection Road Safety Plan, Hamilton (Ward 1)

WHEREAS, the City of Hamilton Vision Zero Action Plan 2019-2025 identifies that no loss of life is acceptable, and that traffic fatalities and injuries are preventable;

WHEREAS, ensuring the safety of vulnerable road users is a priority;

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2022 a teenaged pedestrian was struck and critically injured in a collision at the intersection of Main Street West and Dundurn Street South;

WHEREAS, the intersections of Main Street West at Dundurn Street South and King Street West at Dundurn Street South are identified as intersections with a high frequency of collisions in the 2020 Annual Collision Report; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Operations & Maintenance Division has conducted roadway safety video analytic examinations of the Main Street West at Dundurn Street South and King Street West at Dundurn Street South intersections in 2021 and is facilitating an in-service road safety review of both intersections jointly to identify possible safety enhancements.

#### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That upon the conclusion of the Main Street West at Dundurn Street South and King Street West at Dundurn Street South intersection road safety review that the Transportation Operations & Maintenance Division report back to the Public Works Committee with the review's findings inclusive of costs and a proposed implementation plan; and
- (b) That the Main Street West at Dundurn Street South and King Street West at Dundurn Street South intersection road safety review findings be shared with the City's LRT office for consideration and to identify if any of the proposed safety enhancements could be incorporated into the design of the LRT corridor, if applicable.

## Replacement of Deficient Sidewalk, Curbs and Driveway Approaches (Ward 1)

WHEREAS, the Transportation Operations & Maintenance Division, reviewed Sanders Boulevard, Pearl Street South, Kent Street, Breadalbane and several other streets in Ward 1 and determined that there are areas requiring sidewalk (1845 sq. m), curb (56 m) and/or driveway apron (152 m) repairs;

WHEREAS, the City of Hamilton is committed to creating safe neighbourhoods and vibrant communities.

#### THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That removal and replacement of sidewalk, curb, driveway approaches at deficient areas on streets such as, but not limited to Sanders Boulevard, Pearl Street S, Kent Street, Breadalbane Street be approved to be completed under contract C15-31-19:
- (b) That concrete and asphalt repairs to be funded from the Ward 1 Capital Re-Investment Reserve Fund (#108051) at an upset limit, including contingency, not to exceed \$240,000, be approved; and
- (c) That the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to approve and execute any required agreement(s) and ancillary documents, with such terms and conditions in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
