

Highlights of 2010 - 2011

LEADERSHIP IN ACTION

- Met with government leaders on key public health issues: Dr. Charles Pascal, Special Advisor to the Premier on Early Learning, and Jim Grieve, Assistant Deputy Minister, Early Learning Division, Ministry of Education, to discuss the province's Early Years vision; Judith Wright, Deputy Minister, Ministry of Health Promotion & Sport, to discuss ministry policy and organizational priorities; Laurel Broten, Minister, and George Zegarac, Deputy Minister, Ministry of Children and Youth Services, to discuss proposed enhancements to the Healthy Babies, Healthy Children Program; Margaret Best, Minister of Health Promotion and Sport to discuss strategies for active living across the lifespan.
- Engaged with the Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) on important issues, including Bill 141, an act to strengthen the authority of the CMOH; the CMOH's strategic plan for public health in Ontario; and the Immunization of School Pupils Act.
- Coordinated a meeting between the CMOH and information system developers for environmental health to gain a better understanding of health unit progress regarding system implementation and to discuss the development of data standards.
- Established new Association working groups: the Professional Development Steering Committee and the Records Management Working Group.
- Appointed alPHA members to the Joint Ministries/Boards of Health Committee on Accountability Agreements.

COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIP

- Worked with OPHA on a letter to provincial party leaders requesting their commitment to public health priorities in advance of the fall 2011 provincial election.
- Partnered with the Ontario Agency for Health Protection and Promotion (OAHP) and the Ontario Public Health Association (OPHA) to deliver the successful inaugural conference, *The Ontario Public Health Convention (TOPHC)*, for over 500 public health professionals.
- Collaborated with OPHA to support the OAHP project to develop a new program for applied research and knowledge exchange.
- Supported OAHP in developing an approach to move risk and behaviour surveillance forward in Ontario.
- Continued to co-chair the Ontario Chronic Disease Prevention Alliance and actively participate in the Ontario Health Providers Alliance.
- Continued to work with OAHP on a guidance document for health units interested in childhood healthy weights surveillance.
- Worked with OPHA and the Joint Working Group on the Social Determinants of Health to conduct a survey of health unit activities addressing the social determinants of health.

POSITIONS, STUDIES, REPORTS & PUBLICATIONS

- Presented to the Standing Committee on Social Policy regarding Bill 141 to amend the *Health Protection and Promotion Act*.
- Released the report, *Ontario Public Health Unit Environmental Health System Survey*, which evaluated data collection tools used by environmental health programs in health units.
- Developed Public health is *Key to a Healthy and Prosperous Ontario*, a brief on public health election messages for all provincial political parties and party candidates.

- Released the updated *2011 Orientation Manual for Board of Health Members* following the fall 2010 municipal election.
- In collaboration with OPHA, produced *Activities to Address the Social Determinants of Health in Ontario Local Public Health: Summary Report*.
- Published the *2010-2011 Canadian Directory of Public Health*, an index listing all public health offices in Canada.
- With the Ontario Municipal Social Services Association, produced the *Report on the Joint Forum on Best Start Child and Family Centres - January 19, 2010* in June 2010.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT & MEMBER SERVICES

- Attracted over 90 delegates to the Annual Conference, *The New Essentials: Public Health Communications Today* that was hosted by the Eastern Ontario Health Unit in June 2010.
- Held strategic planning sessions for Boards of Health and the Council of Ontario Medical Officers of Health (COMOH) in fall 2010 to review strategic priorities, and identify structures, processes and resources to move forward.
- Held a Winter Symposium in February 2011, featuring expert speakers and key ministerial staff to build membership consensus on community water fluoridation and public health's role in early learning and care. Also held an Orientation Session for new board of health members during the Symposium.
- Supported alPHA's members to plan the full-day forum, *Public Health Supporting Early Learning and Care*, to discuss public health's role in the new provincial early years platform. The event was attended by Dr. Charles Pascal and ADMs from the ministries of Health and Long-Term Care, Health Promotion and Sport, Education, and Children and Youth Services.
- Procured over 38 hours of continuing medical education credits for alPHA's physician members.
- Procured professional development funding from the MOHLTC to facilitate community medicine residents' attendance at alPHA conferences.



Report from the President and Executive Director

The 2010-11 fiscal year was one punctuated by relationship building and important planning with key government partners. As the *Highlights* section of this report outlines, alPHA sat at leadership tables with all three of our funding ministries—Health and Long-Term Care, Health Promotion and Sport, and Children and Youth Services. The establishment of the Early Years Division in the Ministry of Education resulted in relationships being developed with that ministry as well. Perhaps the most significant evidence of the success of this work was at a February forum of alPHA members on the role of public health in the new provincial early years platform. alPHA members were joined that day by the Special Advisor to the Premier on Early Learning and assistant deputy ministers from the four ministries involved—Health and Long-Term Care, Health Promotion and Sport, Education, and Children and Youth Services.

Our members also represented their colleagues on committees established to look at funding models and accountability in the Ontario public health system. The first accountability agreements, including performance indicators, were developed for public health agencies with strong input from board of health members and public health professionals. We want to thank those who represented us all so very well on these committees—guiding the process, giving input and putting in many long hours in meetings and reviewing materials.

alPHA's June 2010 Annual Conference, hosted in collaboration with the Eastern Ontario Health Unit, was held in Cornwall, Ontario. The Conference's theme, *The New Essentials: Public Health Communications Today*, was timely as delegates and speakers alike were actively engaged in discussions that ranged from understanding today's audiences to using social media to enhance public health messages. We heard from experts and had opportunities to share early experiences with new approaches to public health communication.

The Ontario public health landscape has been changing over the past few years. The occurrence of public health events such as Walkerton, SARS and, most recently, the H1N1 pandemic, has increased the focus on public health. These occurrences have brought new resources to Ontario through the Province's Operation Health Protection strategy and the Capacity Review Committee's recommendations. The increased focus on public health has resulted in alPHA and its members being invited to participate in more planning and decision-making tables. The pressure on alPHA's resources has been building. This year, alPHA's Board of Directors dedicated considerable energy to developing a more strategic approach to doing Association business with a view to ensuring the needs of alPHA's members are met as effectively as possible.

Many of this year's efforts have laid important groundwork for the year to come. We hope you will review alPHA's many accomplishments listed in the *Highlights* section of this report. These accomplishments are evidence of our strength as an Association. We thank alPHA's members for their ongoing support and their unwavering dedication to public health in Ontario. We have been extremely privileged to work with you this past year and we look forward to facing next year's challenges and celebrating success together.


