EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Food and Shelter Advisory Committee (FSAC) is a Volunteer Committee appointed by Council. The Committee has prepared a 2012 Budget submission for approval in the amount of \$500. This budget request is the same as the 2011 approved budget request.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Food and Shelter Advisory Committee (FSAC) is a longstanding volunteer citizen committee that informs City Council through the Emergency and Community Services (E&CS) Committee of issues or policies that impact persons or communities for whom barriers exist to income and food security and access to safe, accessible, adequate shelter. The Committee also provides a forum for intergovernmental and community partner discussion on these matters, and ensures that the perspectives of persons and communities who are experiencing these barriers are taken into consideration in the review of relevant City policies and programs.

The objectives of FSAC are to:

- Ensure that issues, specific to people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless are brought forward and recommendations are provided to the E&CS Committee in a timely manner.
- Ensure that issues, specific to people who are experiencing hunger are brought forward and recommendations are provided to the E&CS Committee in a timely manner.
- Assist with the coordination and implementation of City Council approved recommendations.
- Collaborate and devise innovative, preventative measures to assist in addressing homelessness or hunger issues within the community and to provide those recommendations to the E&CS Committee.
- Identify emerging trends, potential gaps and best practices in food or emergency shelter service needs.
- Educate the community about urgent food and shelter needs through regular reporting to the E&CS Committee.
- Respond in a timely manner to requests for advice from city staff and the E&CS Committee.

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Liaise and collaborate with other committees doing work in the areas of homelessness and affordable housing and to keep apprised of relevant programs and initiatives recognizing the significant relationship emergency food and shelter have with other components of the housing continuum.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS

RELEVANT CONSULTATION

FSAC was consulted regarding their budget needs for 2012 and is in agreement with the recommendation contained in this report.

ANALYSIS / RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

FSAC is requesting \$500 to pay for meeting expenses. FSAC has been fortunate that its members and associated agencies have often helped to defray meeting expenses. In the current economy, however, this is becoming an increasing burden on the members.

The FSAC provides City Council with a valuable perspective regarding issues of emergency food and shelter. FSAC is comprised of service providers and citizens with experience and interest in these issues. They are keenly aware of emerging trends in the community through their work delivering these services and their lived experiences. FSAC uses this experience to provide information to City Council by providing feedback to staff regarding matters of interest to Council as well as through direct reports to the Emergency and Community Services Committee.
