FINANCIAL / STAFFING / LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

Financial: HYAC is requesting approval of \$3,890 for 2012, as well as an additional \$2,500 from the Volunteer Committee Reserve in order to purchase promotional items, and to provide youth development, training and other collaborative opportunities to HYAC members and other Hamilton youth.

In addition, HYAC is in the initial stages of planning Hamilton's first National Youth Week celebration to be held May 1st-7th, 2012.

Staffing: There are no staffing implications associated with the recommendations of this report.

Legal: There are no legal implications associated with the recommendations of this report.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Hamilton Youth Advisory Committee (HYAC) is comprised of a diverse group of young leaders 14 to 24 years of age who are passionate about making a difference in their community. HYAC's mandate is to ensure that youth are involved in the decisions made within the City of Hamilton and the community that affect their lives and the lives of their families and friends. HYAC provides a youth perspective on local issues and advises Council and staff through the Emergency and Community Services Committee.

Addressing issues facing youth, enhancing opportunities for youth and providing a youth voice are the goals of the committee. In addition to fostering positive collaborative relationships between youth and adults and by supporting youth oriented events and programs, HYAC aims to continue to lead by example with integrity, respect and innovation.

ANALYSIS / RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

Since its inception in 2007 by Council, HYAC continues to make significant strides, not only as an advisory committee, but also as a conduit between other youth and youth organizations in the community.

Much of HYAC's work at the end of 2010 and in 2011 has consisted of networking with youth city-wide and raising the committee's public profile. Recruitment of new members took place in December 2010 and early 2011, however, City of Hamilton Advisory Committees were not able to reconvene until April of 2011.

HYAC members supported and continued to participate in community initiatives such as:

- Unfilteredfacts Summit: HYAC members attended ACTION "Spark the movement, Ignite the change" that featured experiential action-oriented sessions, youth facilitators, school sharing/networking, and tons of fun! The Summit armed participants with information and tools they need to tackle youth health issues in their school community.
- Youth-In-Motion Bus Tour of Hamilton: HYAC hosted a free guided bus tour to highlight some of Hamilton's best features, unusual places and hidden treasures. This tour was open to all youth. The objective of this event was to inspire a stronger sense of civic pride and a greater awareness of Hamilton's many gems while also providing an opportunity to network with other youth.
- Wesley Urban Ministries' Raising the Roof Campaign: HYAC members helped to 'put a lid' on youth poverty and homelessness, by joining Wesley Urban Ministries and the Hamilton Bulldogs to sell toques during a hockey game.
- **HYAC's first Cup 'n Run:** Committee members promoted HYAC's new website, **hamiltonyouth.ca** by using eco-friendly drinking cups in the chain link fence overlooking Highway 401 below, Longwood Rd. to the west and Main Street to the North behind the Hamilton Spectator (with their permission).
- It's Alive! The Hamilton Youth Advisory Committee's unique and youth friendly website, hamiltonyouth.ca went live July 28th 2010.

The 2011 approved budget is \$3,890. This funding was used for meeting expenses, orientation of the newly appointed advisory committee, volunteer recognition, communication and other expenses related to the work of HYAC. The newly formed committee will continue to familiarize itself with the City of Hamilton and local government, as well as identify priorities and initiatives they wish to focus on during the next term. One such initiative is National Youth Week. Hamilton is the home of an estimated 70,000 youth. Youth Week is an internationally celebrated event that aims to recognize the positive contributions youth make in their communities and to celebrate the valuable work youth and youth organizations do year round. Since its inception in

1995, Youth Week is now celebrated in several countries. HYAC has undertaken some initial planning and would like to host Youth Week in May 2012.
