- Producing world-class professional theatre that educates, challenges and entertains
- Developing new Canadian work; local artists, designers, skilled technicians and playwrights
- Educating and nurturing the broader creativity of individuals and groups
- Developing accessibility and affordability programs geared to make the theatre inclusive to all citizens

#### Theatre Aquarius – A Creative Catalyst

- 120,000 + visitors annually to Downtown Hamilton
- 2,080,000 patrons since 1991
- 141 public performances of 6 mainstage productions
- 230 professional theatre artists contracted annually, 65+ from the Hamilton region
- 138 volunteers give over 3000 hours annually
- Engage 10,000+ students annually with heavily subsidized tickets for school matinees
- 27 full season employees

# Community Involvement






Theatre Aquarius has a strong history of giving back to the community.

- Holiday fundraising drive raised over \$44,000 over the last 2 years for Hamilton Food Share, with which Hamilton Food Share was able to buy \$220,000 worth of food.
- "Lawyers' Show" Production of *A Man for All Seasons*, produced in co-operation with the Hamilton Lawyers' Club, raised \$103,500 for the Lawyers' Legacy for Children Fund.
- Donate \$150,000 + worth of tickets to local charities annually in support of fundraising efforts.

- 20 tickets available for every performance (2800 annually)


# Theatre Aquarius – Strong Growth, Enormous Potential

- <u>2009</u> Tuesdays With Morrie, starring Jamie Farr sets new box-office records for a non-musical production
  - <u>2010</u> The Rocky Horror Show becomes the highest-grossing show in Theatre Aquarius history
  - <u>2011</u> Buddy: The Buddy Holly Story, starring Hamilton's Jeff Giles, shatters the records set by Rocky Horror and sets a new high-water mark for box-office success.

#### Production Revenue by Season




# Expenses and Revenues, 2010-11 (Audited)
