# **Investment in Affordable Housing (IAH) - Overview**

- \$480.6 million federal/provincial funding for Ontario
- Re-branding of the Canada-Ontario Affordable Housing Program and RRAP
- 4 year program that will end March 31, 2015

#### IAH Funding Allocation

#### Hamilton's allocation:

April 1, 2012 – March 31, 2013: **\$6,924,937** 

April 1, 2013 – March 31, 2014: \$6,937,333

April 1, 2014 – March 31, 2015: \$3,012,711

Total: **\$16,874,982** 



# City's Role - IAH Program Administration

- Program planning, design, delivery, monitoring, reporting and evaluation
- Up to 5% of allocation for program administration
- Execute an administration agreement with the province
- Submit a Council approved *Program Delivery & Fiscal Plan* to the Province
   by Feb. 28, 2012



#### IAH Program Components

- Capital funding up to \$150,000/unit for new rental housing at or below 80% of Average Market Rent
- Homeownership down payment assistance up to 10% of purchase price (limits on purchase price and income)
- Housing allowances to offset rental costs for tenants
- Up to \$25,000/unit to renovate existing housing (Ontario Renovates – replaces the federal RRAP)

# Historical Funding Breakdown - Last 5 Years

- New Rental \$43.3M
- Housing Allowances/Rent Supplement \$12.6M
- RRAP \$8.3M

- Homeowner \$1.8M
- Total \$66M compared to IAH \$16.8M over 4 years

# Developing the PDFP – Elements to Consider

- Focus on most in need
- Cost per unit/household

Hamilton

 Best fit local housing context in terms of higher vacancy rates, relatively affordable rents, and older housing stock in need of repair

# Developing the PDFP – Elements to Consider

- Try to maintain recent funding levels for the program streams (except for new construction)
- Does not address other needs like social housing repair, homelessness funding etc.
- Housing & Homelessness Action
   Plan will provide future direction

# Option 1: New Rental Construction

- IAH funding available: \$16,031,233
- <u>5 year</u> Housing Allowance: \$5,400,000 for 450 households
- New Rental Construction: \$5,400,000 for 36 households
- Ontario Renovates:
   \$4,500,000 for 265 households
- Homeownership: \$731,233 for 40 Households

# Option 2: No New Rental Construction

- IAH funding available: \$16,031,233
- <u>10 year</u> Housing Allowance:
   \$10,800,000 for 450 households
- Ontario Renovates:
   \$4,500,000 for 265 households
- Homeownership:

Hamilton

\$731,233 for 40 households
