

Areas for Improvement in OPHS Compliance

- Higher than anticipated HPV vaccine doses wasted
- Delays in gonorrhoea case investigations
- Delays in immunization reporting for childhood vaccines,
- Disruption in service delivery to schools
- Lower than anticipated uptake of training in the areas of substance abuse and injury prevention
- Fewer resources than needed for prenatal/postnatal and postpartum programs
- Surveillance activities in place for some but not all PHS programs as required.
