Thank you for your Council's request for an amendment to the *Highway Traffic Act* (HTA) that would provide pedestrians with the right of way to assist in creating a complete streets environment. I appreciate the opportunity to respond.

The Ministry of Transportation supports municipal efforts to develop complete streets. Ministry staff are currently working with a number of municipalities, including the cities of Ottawa, Toronto and Hamilton, on updating the Ontario Traffic Manual Book 15: Pedestrian Facilities.

This project will review several new pedestrian crossing facilities with the objective of introducing a range of protected pedestrian crossings to fit different road environments. As these pedestrian crossings are finalized, right of way between pedestrians and motorists will be a key consideration. It would be more appropriate to have this work completed in advance and then consider the necessary amendments to related Ontario Regulations.

I am confident this approach will assist in creating a complete streets environment that will consider the safety of all road users, including pedestrians and cyclists.
