4. BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

4.1 Role & Function of Hamilton Veterans Committee Update: Elizabeth Wakeford, Cultural Projects Specialist Carrie Brooks-Joiner, Senior Project Manager Next steps for revised Terms of Reference

Staff interviewed 14 individuals who were identified as key people by the HVC and Geordie Elms. John Dinsmore – Canadian Military Tattoo Geordie Elms - Special Assistant to the Mayor on Military Heritage and Protocol Bob Fyfe – Chair HVC, President United Council of Veterans Lawrence Hatfield – Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders Hoojung Jones – Korea Veterans Association Grant Lawson - RHLI Linda Furchner - RHLI Gerry Rattray – member HVC Mike Rehill - RHLI Richard Seager - Canadian Military Tattoo Gord Sharpe, RCL Branch 36, Dundas David Steckham – member HVC John Terrance – Canadian Military Tattoo Art Tompkins – member HVC, RCL Branch 622 Stoney Creek

All of the interviewees were very helpful and quite willing to assist. Staff identified common thoughts, key findings. Staff heard HVC roles and responsibilities are not understood in broader military community. All interviewees understood the HVC was responsible for Remembrance Day. All felt that Remembrance Day could be more inclusive of those currently serving and that the HVC could be more reflective of broader military community in Hamilton.

Staff developed two recommendations for HVC's consideration.

- Mandate committee focus should be on Remembrance and commemoration activities. Councillor Merulla is concerned about the committee losing their advocacy mandate particularly with Federal gov't. Recommendation is to make focus clearer to potential new members.
- Membership in addition to veterans, include current serving members of the military (include Reservists) who share commitment to Remembrance and commemoration. Add one and only one citizen member with background as a necessary resource such as Fern Viola.

Unanimous that HVC approves of recommendations and request staff to come back with a revised Terms of Reference for consideration.

4.2 Fields of Honour

Update: Rebecca spoke to Crystabelle. She will provide report shortly.

4.3 Event Template / Dropbox

Update: both template and dropbox are in use. David hasn't received any feedback on the dropbox. Item can be removed from Agenda. Remembrance Day Manual draft was shared with members. It puts all roles, responsibilities in one place, outlines prep work necessary. Next steps – flesh out roles of HVC and City staff.

4.4 Remembrance Day 2014

Garrison Parade – Sunday, November 9 City Service – Tuesday, November 11

Location discussion – LIUNA Station suggested for Nov 9, City Hall forecourt for Nov 11.

Investigate possibility of a temporary marker at which to lay the wreaths. Investigate with Geordie if something suitable exists.

Invite Tourism and Culture event staff for remainder of 2014 meetings.

Need to ensure public are made aware of the location changes well in advance.

Deadlines for decisions: Location - February meeting Temporary marker - March meeting

4.5 Veterans Place at Gore Park - Gore Park Pedestrianization

Update: staff met with Le'Ann Seely January 13. Ken Coit, Art in Public Places Coordinator is meeting with the designers of enclaves. Staff will contact the 14 people involved in the roles and responsibilities interviews as to what should be on the enclaves. Staff will come forward with several suggestions that HVC will participate in choosing the final content.
