

BACKGROUND:

National Victims of Crime Awareness Week 2014

The Victim Services Branch, of the Hamilton Police Service, recognizes the annual National Victims of Crime Awareness Week (NVCAW) 2014.

On Monday, April 8, 2014, the Victim Services Branch will be hosting a community ceremony honouring victims of crime. Featured speaker will be Dr. Lori Triano-Antidormi, mother of Zachary Lawrence Antidormi and practicing Psychologist.

There will be a community information fair with agencies on hand to share information available to victims of crime. There will also be refreshments. Public attendance and media coverage is welcomed.

Events take place at 10:00 a.m. at the front courtyard of Central Station, 155 King William Street, Hamilton.

This event is made possible through a grant for Department of Justice Canada Victims Fund to commemorate NVCAW.

On-line Police Checks

In December 2013, Hamilton Police launched its on-line option for police checks. So far, statistics indicate that in the first three (3) months of the program, 400 people have utilized this service. Hamilton Police will continue to utilize social media to promote this option which is well-timed for the seasonal surge in police check demands as students and adults apply for summer employment and volunteer positions.

Cops and Kids – Connecting on Ice, Connecting in Life II

The second, almost annual Cops and Kids - Connecting on Ice, Connecting in Life II, takes place on March 26, 2014 at the First Ontario Credit Centre, formerly Copps Coliseum, from 10:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. This ProAction Cops and Kids event will see Hamilton Police Officers helping students from grades one (1) through eight (8) from north-end schools with on and off ice skating activities. Over 300 students will be attending and both Auxiliary Officers and Hamilton Police volunteers will be assisting.
