Background

- 2006 discussion paper Accessible Bus Stop Design
- No criteria in Ontario Reg. 191/11 AODA, 2005 for accessible transit stops
- March 18, 2013 Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities presented to Public Works Committee:

"Accessibility and Bus Stops in Hamilton Photo Essay Demonstrating Poorly and Well-Constructed Bus Stops Throughout Hamilton"

- Identified 28 stops with accessibility problems
- Recommended guidelines
- Transportation Division staff committed to a bus stop accessibility audit

Transit Bus Stops Accessibility Review

- Purpose is to inventory, establish guidelines, evaluate and identify all transit stops in regard to accessibility.
- The audit is being undertaken in two (2) phases:
 - 1. Development of accessibility criteria and an audit of the 28 bus stops identified by the ACPD
 - 2. City-wide audit of all bus stops (approx. 2,400)

- Transit Bus Stop
 Accessibility
 Criteria &
 Guidelines
- Guidelines include general requirements for an accessible stop
- Intended to supplement AODA & all applicable standards (e.g. urban braille)



Phase 1 Audit Results of 28 Stops

- 10 stops meet the criteria, 5 of which had already been retrofitted
- 3 stops are in rural road cross sections
- 2 stops will be re-constructed as part of "Quick Wins"
 A & B Line Amenities
- 1 stop identified is the MacNab Terminal Facility
- 2 stops involve private property
- 10 stops identified for potential retrofitting




