# Mandate approved May 14, 2014

Reporting to Council, the Hamilton Veterans Committee oversees the planning and delivery of military remembrance and commemoration activities on behalf of the City of Hamilton. When directed by Council, the Committee will provide input on projects and issues that are of concern to Hamilton Veterans. e.g. Veteran parking, Monuments and Cenotaphs and Veterans' Field of Honour.

Assist in the coordination of significant Veteran's commemorative events for the City of Hamilton.

### Membership – 2015 and beyond

In an effort to better represent the Veterans of the City of Hamilton on May 14, 2014 Council approved a new membership criteria for the Hamilton Veterans Committee. This criteria is in effect for the 2015 – 2018 term of Council.

Up to 9 members of which one may be a member at large. Members are required to be a City of Hamilton resident AND one of the following:

- A veteran; OR
- A current or former member of the Canadian Forces; OR
- A current or former member of the Canadian Forces Reserves; OR
- Meet the requirement of a member at large.

A member (at large) is required to demonstrate a special interest in veterans' projects and issues through their work in the community





# Remembrance Day & Memorial Services


Provide direction and coordination for the Hamilton Remembrance Day Parade and Service, and two Decoration Day Memorial Services

Communicate with all Hamilton Veterans groups: the Order of Service, Parade Orders, volunteer dignitaries, i.e. Saluting Officer, Clergy, etc.

Work with community citizens and local organizations as they assist in the coordination of Remembrance Day.

Provide assistance (logistical, etc.) to specific events, (e.g. Dieppe Memorial Service)

Provide approval for any use of Hamilton Cenotaph

Representation on the Gore Park Master Plan committee related to Gore Park, the Cenotaph and Veterans Place at Gore Park

Advocated for free parking for all Hamilton Veterans

Completed the Commemorative naming of James Street North and South as "Veterans Way of Remembrance"
