



STATISTICS CANADA CRIME RATES





OMBI TOTAL CRIME RATE





 Analysis, over past 3 years:


- Total calls-for-service remain stable approx. 150,000

CHANGING NATURE OF CRIME

Internet Crime - Cyberbullying, Identity Theft, Child Pornography, Sexual Offences against Children

GROWING SOCIAL CONCERNS

- Increase in demonstrations, protests
- 1 in 10 in Canada had mental or substance abuse problems in 2012, 1 in 5 in the General Population
- 1 in 6 Canadian soldiers affected by mental health and alcohol-related issues in 2013
- Increase in calls regarding vulnerable populations homeless, mentally health etc.
- Hamilton has greatest concentration of registered sex offenders in Southern Ontario with one of the Highest Compliance Rates





POLICING CONTEXT

HAMILTON'S ECONOMY IS GROWING

Economic growth

- n Infrastructure investments continue at record pace
- n Fastest growing economy in Ontario at 2.5% in 2013
- n The best place in Ontario to invest over the next 5 years

Labour market

- n Total employment projected to grow by 1% in 2014
- Employment growth expected to accelerate further to 1.5% in 2015 and 1.4% in 2016
- n Unemployment rate to decline to 6.2% in 2014 and 6% in the next 2 years

Housing demands / Average Price

- n Increased employment will translate into higher housing demands in 2014 and 2015
- Average house price projected to grow by 4.7% in 2014 and 2.7% in 2015.


HPS 10% Operational Impact


