#### RECOMMENDATION

That the overall 2014 Community Partnership Program (CPP) surplus, in the amount of \$131,668 be transferred to the Community Partnership Reserve Account #112230

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The total budget in the Community Partnership Program (CPP) for 2014 is \$3,212,200. During the 2014 budget process, a one-time increase of \$65,000 to fund the Special Events deficit was approved to be funded from the CPP Reserve. As well, one-time funding from the Tax Stabilization Reserve was approved for the Agricultural and Rural Affairs Advisory Committee - \$5,000, and the James Street North Supercrawl event - \$80,000.

As at the 2014 year-end, the CPP shows a surplus balance of \$131,668. The CPP Reserve Account # 112230 had a 2014 opening balance of \$512,002. During the year, Council approved transfers totalling \$105,000, leaving a balance of \$407,002.
