| Proposed Cat Licensing Program |

WHEREAS the City of Hamilton regulates and licenses dogs and pot bellied pigs under the Responsible Animal Ownership By-Law 12-031;

AND WHEREAS the licensing of dogs creates responsible pet ownership, provides food, shelter, medical care for lost pets, helps return lost pets to their owners and helps support adoption programs;

AND WHEREAS the licensing of cats in such Cities as Calgary, Toronto and London have seen a reduction in stray cats, impound and euthanasia rates and an increase in adoptions within their perspective Cities;

AND WHEREAS a Cat Licensing program would create sustainable revenue for programs such as an increased microchipping registration program; a low cost spay/neutering program; a reduction in overpopulation of cats crisis and support a Trap/Neuter/Release program for feral cats;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That staff be directed to examine the feasibility of implementing a Cat Licensing Program within By-law 12-031;
- (b) That staff be directed to examine any resources available to increase the microchipping registration of cats, and strategically manage the over-population of cats in Hamilton, thus resulting in responsible cat ownership.
