With a pt on board, its the same as the 35A. I have had to pay closer attention as to where we park. With the truck on a slight angle to the area behind the truck, it makes loading the stretcher into the mount hard. It can take several adjustments to line the pegs up enough to slide down and lock in place. People have been saying that its too heavy to bring into a house but the only time I've brought a 35A into a house is when theres a ramp or 1 - 2 steps. Noticed some nuances to be mindful of, i.e.. parking on inclines and declines, not an issue but flat loading surfaces are ideal, had to take stretcher up two small stairs to playground, not an issue, would like to see another O2 regulator for Dtank on truck and the PPE bag interferes with the telescoping, working on another place for PPE to be stored.
