Re: Amendments to the Ontario Public Health Standards - Disease-Specific Chapters of

Appendix A and Provincial Case Definitions of Appendix B of the Infectious Diseases

Protocol, 2013

I am writing to inform you of the following changes to the Ontario Public Health Standards (OPHS):

• A number of disease-specific chapters of Appendix A and provincial case definitions of Appendix B of the *Infectious Diseases Protocol* have been updated.

The changes were made by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (the ministry) and Public Health Ontario (PHO), based on input from public health units. All changes will come into effect immediately.

Changes were made to the disease-specific chapters of Appendix A and provincial case definitions of Appendix B of the *Infectious Diseases Protocol* for the following diseases:

- Acute Flaccid Paralysis
- Amebiasis
- Cryptosporidiosis
- Gastroenteritis, Institutional Outbreaks
- Listeriosis
- Lyme Disease
- Respiratory Infection Outbreaks in Institutions
- Tuberculosis

Changes were made to the following provincial case definition of Appendix B of the *Infectious Diseases Protocol*:

- Adverse Events Following Immunization (AEFIs)
- Giardiasis

A summary of all changes is included in the *Document History* section that has been added to the disease-specific chapters of Appendix A and provincial case definitions of Appendix B.
