(ii) Surplus Municipal Property – 0 Highway 8 and 0, 6th Concession Road West, Flamborough, being Part Lots 14 and 15, Concession 5, designated as Parts 6 to 20, 22 and 23, Plan 62R-275 (Ward 14) (Item 9.2)

WHEREAS, the lands described as Parts 6 – 20, 22 and 23 on Reference Plan 62R-275 are located on the north limit of Highway 8, west of Westfield Village and east of Concession 6;

AND WHEREAS, these lands are comprised of approximately 100 acres of wooded wetlands and are split-zoned "A" – Agriculture and "CM" – Conservation Management;

AND WHEREAS, these lands were originally described as parts on a reference plan and sold by the prior owner in a "checker boarding "manner in their attempt to circumvent the *Planning Act*;

AND WHEREAS, the City of Hamilton obtained title to these lands by a Notice of Vesting Instrument Number VM279709 registered on September 16, 2009, as a result of a failed tax sale;

AND WHEREAS the Hamilton Conservation Authority has formally expressed a desire to acquire these lands from the City, at no cost, to facilitate the expansion of the Westfield Heritage Village as a destination conservation area for multi season recreational activity, and natural heritage protection;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- (a) That the City of Hamilton sell the lands known as 0 Highway 8 and 0, 6th Concession Road West, Flamborough, being Part Lots 14 and 15, Concession 5, designated as Parts 6 to 20, 22 and 23, Plan 62R-275 to the Hamilton Conservation Authority for \$2.00, which lands are to be used as an adjunct to the Westfield Heritage Village Conservation Area;
- (b) That the Manager of Real Estate be authorized and directed to negotiate an Offer to Purchase with the Hamilton Conservation

Authority (HCA) for the sale of the subject lands to the HCA, on an "as is, where is" basis, for the nominal consideration of \$2.00, in accordance with the Sale of Land Policy By-law No. 14-204;

- (c) That the City Solicitor be authorized and directed to complete the real estate transaction on behalf of the City, respecting the purchase and sale of the lands known as 0 Highway 8 and 0, 6th Concession Road West, Flamborough, being Part Lots 14 and 15, Concession 5, designated as Parts 6 to 20, 22 and 23, Plan 62R-275 to the Hamilton Conservation, on such terms and conditions as she considers reasonable; and,
- (d) That the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized and directed to execute the necessary documents, respecting the purchase and sale of the lands known as 0 Highway 8 and 0, 6th Concession Road West, Flamborough, being Part Lots 14 and 15, Concession 5, designated as Parts 6 to 20, 22 and 23, Plan 62R-275 to the Hamilton Conservation in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
