Re: Canada Post's decision to continue home mail delivery in downtown Toronto and Montreal

We are pleased to hear that Canada Post is likely to keep home mail delivery in the downtown core of Toronto and Montreal. But why are Toronto and Montreal being singled out for special treatment? Other cities in our country deserve the same standard of service as these cities.

Is Canada Post going to provide door-to-door delivery in the downtown core of other cities, or is it moving towards a two-tier system of delivery in city centres?

The union is also encouraged to see that Canada Post has started to back off of its plan to end all home mail delivery and expects to hear additional good news in the weeks and months to come, especially now that all opposition parties have indicated they will stop the home mail delivery cuts, if elected.

CUPW believes there is increasing recognition that there is absolutely no need for this massive cut to public postal service. Canada Post is still making profits and could be making even more money if it added financial and banking services like other post offices around the world.

The union would like to reiterate its request for a full copy of the corporation's four-year study on postal banking indicating that postal banking "would be a win-win strategy".
