




Downtown Cleanliness Services

Primary Service Area – Program Scope

- Manual ground litter collection (7 days a week)
- Emptying litter and public space containers (twice daily as required)
- Servicing cigarette receptacles (as required)
- Sidewalk power-sweeping (5 days per week)
- Sidewalk power-washing (5 days per week, mid-April to mid-November)
- Maintenance of poster kiosks (monthly)
- Curbside waste collection (weekly on scheduled collection day)
- Alley maintenance (5 days a week)
- Roadway mechanical sweeping (Roads nightly)
- Road & sidewalk maintenance (Roads Patrolled by staff and on complaint basis)

Expanded Service Area – Program Scope

- Manual ground litter collection (as required inspected frequently)
- Emptying litter and public space containers (7 days a week)
- Servicing cigarette receptacles (as required)
- Sidewalk power-sweeping sidewalks (as required)
- Alleys (5 days a week)
- Roadway mechanical sweeping (Roads nightly)
- Road & sidewalk maintenance (Roads Patrolled by staff and on complaint basis)

Labour Resources – Downtown Cleanliness Program

Council Approved Staffing Levels

- 2 1041 Waste Supervisor
- 7 Waste Labourers
- ➢ 9 Waste Operators
 - Alleyway Maintenance
 - Sidewalk power sweeping
 - Sidewalk power washing (April November nights)
- 2.5 Public Space Litter Containers (7 days a week, city wide 600+ receptacles, nights)

Budget 2015 – 2.2 million

Sidewalk power-washing


Increased service level starting in 2014 with additional power-washing unit

Downtown Improvements

Tree Base Maintenance

- Repaired concrete tree bases at 18 locations along King St E.
- Rubber tree ring installation along James St.
 - Expansion along James St. (>50 trees)
 - Tree rings improve sidewalk sweeping operations
 - Provides better tree root protection
 - Positive feedback

Cigarette Receptacles

- Serviced weekly year-round
- In 2013, introduced cigarette receptacles mounted on litter containers in Downtown Hamilton (previous pilot in the Ottawa St. BIA)
- Recently installed vinyl wraps on cigarette receptacles to make them identifiable to the public

Alleyway Cleanliness

- ➢ New initiative as of July 2013
- Program objective to improve cleanliness and reduce illegal dumping in alleys City wide
- 5 day per week schedule as a proactive approach for service delivery
- King Street Alley 2014/2015 success story






