THE BOARD OF HEALTH PRESENTS REPORT 15-010 AND RESPECTFULLY RECOMMENDS:

1. Infectious Disease and Environmental Health Semi-Annual Report (BOH15024) (City Wide) (Item 5.1)

Rob Hall, Director, Public Health Services introduced Marcia Nauta, Public Health Nurse/ Bed Bug Navigator, Public Health Services, and David Brodati, Manager, Investment in Affordable Housing, Community and Emergency Services, who are both involved in the Community Bed Bug Strategy.

Marcia Nauta, Public Health Nurse addressed the Board with a fictional account of real-life experiences with bed bugs in the City of Hamilton, entitled "Arthur's Story". Her comments included, but were not limited to:

 Arthur is a retired man who has downsized from a house to a onebedroom apartment with his wife

- Arthur's wife passed away, and Arthur suffered from a stroke, and when in hospital, he discovered that he had bed bugs bites
- The situation became much worse at home, and Arthur became isolated from his neighbours, friends and family
- At this point, Arthur came into contact with Public Health Services
- Arthur was given support and direct help

David Brodati, Manager, Investment in Affordable Housing presented the Community Bed Bug Strategy, with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation. A copy of the presentation has been added to the public record. The presentation included, but was not limited to:

- Bed bug calls, yearly totals
- The Strategy is a coordinated city-wide approach
- Mission, Goals and Priority Areas of the Strategy
- Capital Request
- Community Stakeholders
- Current City involvement

The presentation from Marcia Nauta, Public Health Nurse/ Bed Bug Navigator, Public Health Services, and David Brodati, Manager, Investment in Affordable Housing, Community and Emergency Services respecting Report BOH14010(a)/CES14013(a) the Community Bed Bug Strategy, was received.

Larry Huibers, Co-Chair, Bed Bug Advisory Action Group presented an overview of their group's involvement with the Community Bed Bug Strategy, with the aid of a PowerPoint presentation. Marisa Scotto di Luzio, Hamilton Community Legal Clinic, Bed Bud Advisory Action Group addressed the Board respecting the Community Bed Bug Strategy. Her comments included, but were not limited to:

- The Hamilton Community Legal Clinic provides free advice and representation to low income residents, including assistance with housing
- Hamilton Community Legal Clinic legal supports the Community Bed Bug Strategy and a continuation of the Bed Bug Assistance program supporting vulnerable citizens
- Bed bug infestation can be financially devastating to low income tenants because unit preparation is strenuous and expensive
- Public Health Services has offered valuable assistance to tenants.

The verbal presentation provided by Marisa Scotto di Luzio, Hamilton Community Legal Clinic respecting Report BOH14010(a)/CES14013(a) Community Bed Bug Strategy, was received.
