Higher rates of

- diabetes, high blood pressure, & anxiety in adults
- depression & suicide in teens
- health care use

When income is too low, people do not have enough money for rent, bills, AND food







\$827 Monthly food cost for a family of four*

(Based on results of 2015 Hamilton Nutritious Food Basket Survey)


*Family of four = male + female (31-50yrs) + boy (14yrs) + girl (7yrs)

\$1030 Monthly housing cost for a family of four*

(Based on average rental cost for a 3-bedroom apartment in Hamilton in 2014; may or may not include utilities)

All other monthly expenses = utilities, telephone, childcare, transportation, clothing, dental and medical costs, etc.

Not enough \$\$\$ is the root cause of food insecurity

What can be done?

Base social assistance rates on the actual cost of living

Increase number of affordable housing units

More employers paying a Living Wage

Investigate a basic income guarantee program
