**RECOMMENDATION**

That the Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities (ACPD) 2016 base budget submission in the amount of \$1,500 be approved and referred to the 2016 budget process for consideration.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

In accordance with the process for submission of budgets for the Sub-committees of Council, the Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities budget for 2016, in the amount of \$1,500, is being submitted with the recommendation that it be approved.

ACPD at their November 10, 2015 meeting approved a motion to be sent to Council to request a budget of \$1,500 each year to cover the cost for two members to attend a yearly accessibility conference, usually held within Ontario. The committee does not have a pre-existing base budget to draw on to cover such costs.

## **HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (Chronology of events)**

The Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities is a sub-committee of Council providing advice and making recommendations to Council and city staff regarding City policies, procedures and guidelines that address the needs and concerns of persons with disabilities, including providing input regarding the preparation, implementation and monitoring of the Ontarians with Disabilities, 2001 Act and the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act and its regulations.

Each year there are several accessibility conferences and/or seminars that the Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities members have expressed interest in attending so that they can participate in these valuable learning and input sessions. The membership feels that the City of Hamilton has made great strides in some areas and have many successes and best practices that should be shared with other provincial counterparts. In order for this to become a reality the committee will develop a yearly plan for participating in these opportunities.

The Advisory Committee for Persons with Disabilities discussed their 2016 budget needs at their November 10, 2015 meeting.

The recommendation will provide funding for two members of the Advisory For Persons with Disabilities, to attend a yearly accessibility conference and thus enable them to fulfil their terms of reference. The ACPD is asking for a base budget of \$1,500.
