#### (i) Helping to Shape the Vision for the Future of Hamilton (Item 6.1)

Ms. Deb Clinton a Neighbourhood Development Consultant, Neighbourhood Action Strategy provided the Committee with a presentation entitled "Helping to Shape the Vision for the Future of Hamilton.

The presentation consisted of background information on Vision 2020, The Our Future Hamilton Campaign; Phase 1-3 with a facilitated discussion that centred on the following four questions:

1. What do you love about Hamilton?

- 2. What are the challenges you face as a person living with a disability in Hamilton?
- 3. Are there opportunities you think we should know about and highlight?
- 4. Can you name five things that can be changed to make it easier for you to work, live and play in Hamilton?

Responses to question 1, what do you love about Hamilton includes:

- More Lemonade stands
- Walking trails-waterfalls
- Arts-bayfront park & Trails
- HSR- neighbourhood associations and how they work together
- Parks, playgrounds, festivals
- Our social services particularly immigration services
- Diversity of City
- The geographical location..close to Toronto/Niagara
- Good access to most locations in the city
- The volunteerism and citizen engagement
- We have barrier free guidelines approved by City Council
- Sobi bikes

Responses to question 2, what are the challenges we face include:

- Access to our trails and waterfalls
- Transportation keeping pace with growth
- Prioritizing transportation
- Public support for transportation
- DARTs and accessible transportation (taxis)
- Access to historical buildings
- Cutbacks to services that allow people to live independently
- Helping businesses and services to become accessible
- Clarify the role of the 3 levels of government...who does what
- Challenge of the demographics...how to plan for the future
- Making sure there is housing with supports
- Housing and services with dignity
- Hamilton website still needs improvement
- Open data
- Limited accessible design for all buildings in the City of Hamilton barrier free not applied everywhere
- Snow removal

Responses to question 3, what are the opportunities included:

- New jobs-better economy
- Creating low income housi ng in repurposed buildings
- · Opportunity for mixed housing
- Increased tourism
- Missing economic opportunities

- Utilizing out Advisory Committees-volunteer committees for input and guidance
- People are engaged and we have the tools to become fully accessible

Responses to the 4<sup>th</sup> question, list five things you would change included:

- Have a concise complete housing inventory particularly for people with disabilities
- Stigma of the City of Hamilton;
- low cost and subsidized housing
- A plan for gentrification
- Reduce dependence on cars which would help with the pollution
- More health and disability research through our schools /hospitals
- Improve snow removal
- Incentives to start small businesses coordinated with employment support for those over the age of 50
- Perceived social differences between the downtown and the mountain

#### (i) Update - Multi-Year Accessibility Plan (Item 9.1)

The Committee discussed the Multi-Year Accessibility Plan, noting the vast amount of research that has been completed across Canada, however, there is only one municipality with a plan in place.

Members of the Committee are currently reviewing that plan.

The Committee noted that 'individuals in wheelchairs' should be a matter for discussion immediately following a future ACPD meeting; the meeting should be one hour in length and individuals with walkers should also be invited.

#### (ii) Christmas Meeting (December 8, 2015) (Item 9.2)

The Clerk was asked to book the meeting room for an extra hour on the December 8, 2015.

P. Kilburn will be responsible for the coordination of the pot luck.

#### (iii) Mental Health First Aid Course (Item 9.3)

E. Lindeboom suggested that the Hamilton Police Service initiate the use of the Mental Health First Aid Course offered by the Mental Health Commission, which is a 12-hour course, taken over two days.
