BACKGROUND:

Hamilton Police Service Victim Services Branch Prostitution Exit Support Services Grant

Recognizing the need in Hamilton to support sex workers who are looking to exit, the Hamilton Police Service Victim Services Branch received a five-year Prostitution Exit Support Services Grant, made possible through the Department of Justice Canada Victims Fund.

The benefits of this grant will augment the existing work of community initiatives and will enhance education and awareness along with providing direct benefits to individuals.

The project's main components are:

- Billboard and posters with contact information for the Victim Services Branch and organizations that provide options, safe places, resources and supports in the Hamilton region.
- Educating agency front line workers on supporting individuals involved in sex work.

The Victim Services Branch has collaborative partnerships and engages in providing a triage of service for persons exiting sex work which includes: Good Shepherd Notre Dame House, SACHA – Sexual Assault Centre of Hamilton and Area, Rlizabeth Fry Society Southern Ontario Region and the Sexual Assault/Domestic Violence Care Centre Hamilton Health Sciences.

"This grant will directly support those who are making choices about their next steps in leaving sex work and it will also provide front line agency workers with some resources to do this," said Theresa Di Clemente, Coordinator, Hamilton Police Service Victim Services Branch.

Hamilton Police Service Victim Services Branch worked with community agencies to develop the campaign strategy that addresses the unique needs of the Hamilton community.

Established in 1992, Victim Services is a Branch within the Hamilton Police Service. Victim Services is the only 24/7 crisis intervention agency for victims of crime and trauma serving the residents of the City of Hamilton. Victim Services Branch responds to the immediate needs of people who have been victimized by crime and/or trauma

such as homicides, suicides, sudden death, assaults, sexual assaults, motor vehicle and fire fatalities, robberies and harassment.

In 2015, HPS Victim Services Branch assisted 2,128 new victims and had 6,127 total contacts with victims including new and existing clients.

Since 2013, the Hamilton Police Victim Services Branch has received approval from the Ministry of the Attorney General and the Hamilton Police Services Board to enter into an agreement to administer the Victim Quick Response Program (VQRP) offering timely financial assistance to victims of violent crime including victims of sexual assault and human trafficking.



Cops and Kids Connecting on Ice Connecting in Life

The Hamilton Police Service laced up for this year's Cops and Kids Connecting on Ice Connecting in Life skating event. The event was held on March 9, 2016, from 10:00 am - 3:00 pm, at the First Ontario Centre.

This was the third Cops and Kids Connecting on Ice Connecting in Life ProAction event to take place and over 400 elementary school students throughout the Hamilton area are set to attend. This event provides students with a great opportunity to connect with Police Officers, as well as provides Hamilton Police with a great opportunity to engage with youth and build bridges within the community.

Throughout the day, elementary school students not only skated, they also participated in various activities such as colouring contests, basketball shooting contests, a magic show, and more fun zone activities. Students will also be given the opportunity to score

on a Hamilton Police Officer goalie in a fun ball hockey shoot out. Lunch will also be provided by Maple Lodge Farms.

Cops and Kids Connecting on Ice Connecting in Life was developed in 2012 by Hamilton Police Officer Jerome Stewart.

"The idea started with my role as a Youth and School Officer in the north end of Hamilton," said Officer Stewart, "This gave me the opportunity to meet children who many were new residents to the country and others were living under financial restraints. I wanted to give these children the opportunity to enjoy a great Canadian passion, while interacting with Hamilton Police."
