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### **THE PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE PRESENTS REPORT 16-008 AND RESPECTFULLY RECOMMENDS:**

**1. Flooding and Lawn Reconstruction on Lake Avenue Drive (PW16036) (Ward 8) (Item 5.1)**

That Report PW16036 respecting Flooding and Lawn Reconstruction on Lake Avenue Drive, be received.

**2. 2015 Annual Energy Report (PW16032) (City Wide) (Item 5.2)**

That Report PW16032 - the 2015 Annual Energy Report, be received.

**3. Standardization of Traffic Control Equipment and Material, Signal Controllers (Timers), Software and Associated Equipment (PW16033) (City Wide) (Item 5.3)**

- (a) That the National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA) Advanced Transportation Controller (ATC) current version 5.2b (version will be amended from time to time) be designated as the City's traffic signal controller standard pursuant to Procurement Policy #14 – Standardization;
- (b) That the D4 software for use with the National Electrical Manufacturers Association (NEMA) Advanced Transportation Controller (ATC) compliant controllers be designated as a standard through December 31, 2021, pursuant to Procurement Policy #14 – Standardization;
- (c) That Fourth Dimension Traffic be approved as the single source vendor, pursuant to Procurement Policy #11 – Non-competitive Procurements, to provide the supply, integration, training, technical services and maintenance for the D4 product;
- (d) That the General Manager of Public Works, or designate, be authorized and directed to enter into and sign on behalf of the City of Hamilton, all negotiated agreements and associated documents with Fourth Dimension Traffic in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.

**4. Report of the Hamilton Cycling Committee dated May 2, 2016 respecting Cycling Education in Ontario Schools (Item 5.4)**

That the Report of the Hamilton Cycling Committee dated May 2, 2016 and attached as Appendix A to PW Report 16-008, be approved.

**5. Red Light Camera (RLC) Program – New Site for 2017 (Item 8.1)**

- (a) That the following locations be approved for the installation of Red Light Cameras in 2017:
  - (i) Charlton Avenue East & John Street South – Southbound (Ward 2)
  - (ii) Mohawk Road West & Upper Paradise Road – Westbound (Ward 8)
  - (iii) Hess Street North & York Boulevard – Eastbound (Ward 2)
  - (iv) Dundas Street East & Mill Street South – Westbound (Ward 15)
  - (v) Highway 8 & Green Road – Westbound (Ward 10);

- (b) That for 2017, a Court Administration Clerk (1.0 FTE) within the Provincial Offences Administration (POA) office with a gross cost of \$78,500, fully funded by additional Red Light Camera revenue for no net levy increase, be approved.

**6. Various Repairs and Projects in Ward 2 (Item 9.1)**

- (a) That staff be directed to complete the following repairs/projects within Ward 2 at the estimated listed costs with funding to come from the Ward 2 Area Rating Account No. 108052:
  - (i) Elgin Alleyway Project: \$20,000
  - (ii) Open Streets Maintenance: \$1,000
  - (iii) PlanLocal Resident Driven *1 Million Safe Streets Campaign*: \$65,000
  - (iv) Sidewalk Rehabilitation Reserve: \$100,000
  - (v) Dog Park Amenities: \$20,000
  - (vi) 2<sup>nd</sup> Level Graffiti Clean-up Cost Share: \$3,500
  - (vii) Speed Hump Reserve: \$60,000;
  - (viii) *Retrofit for new Support Services Hub at 181 Jackson Street (Hamilton CityHousing)***
- (b) That the General Manager of Public Works be authorized to prepare, advertise and award tenders as required for the above-noted works.

- (iii) PlanLocal Resident Driven *1 Million Safe Streets Campaign*: \$65,000
- (iv) Sidewalk Rehabilitation Reserve: \$100,000
- (v) Dog Park Amenities: \$20,000
- (vi) 2<sup>nd</sup> Level Graffiti Clean-up Cost Share: \$3,500
- (vii) Speed Hump Reserve: \$60,000;
- (viii) *Retrofit for new Support Services Hub at 181 Jackson Street (Hamilton CityHousing)***

(b) That the General Manager of Public Works be authorized to prepare, advertise and award tenders as required for the above-noted works.
