## 4.1 HVC Events Information / Procedure Manual

Revisions discussed at the December 8 General Meeting have been included by Dave. He is still waiting for maps.

## 4.2 Parking for Veterans in Hamilton

Guests: Marty Hazell, Senior Director, Parking and By-law Services Ted Arnold, Manager, Parking Operations and Maintenance Sebastian Stula, Supervisor, Parking Services

Chair, Bob Fyfe, introduced the guests.

Sebastian – on July 15, 2015 Council approved the expanded Veterans' parking program to include all vehicles with a Veterans plate excluding the RCMP. The program was implemented on October 1. A letter was sent out and a new permit issued to those Veterans already registered in the previous program. Newly eligible veterans had to attend the office at 80 Main West. In order to include the exemption of the RCMP it was necessary to continue the permit part of the program. Permit is designed to hang from the rearview mirror so it is visible to By-law officers. 270 permits were issued to veterans that had been registered under the old program. Prior to last year (2015) there were about 350 Veterans registered each year. To date 322 permits have been issued. In the Spring staff will investigate where permits are being used, any patterns and will report to the General Issues Committee (GIC) prior to September 30 when the pilot program expires. Note: it may be difficult to isolate patterns as so few permits have been issued.

Councillor Johnson – intent was if you had a Veterans plate you were included in the program. Because Council's final resolution said the RCMP were to be excluded, it was necessary to issue the additional permit to monitor this exclusion. If they are a Veteran who happens to work for the RCMP they would be included. If they have a plate because they are RCMP, they are excluded.

Note: There are approximately 20 retired RCMP in Hamilton.

The committee questioned whether staff has noticed a reduction in parking fees. Simple answer is no as the number of permits issued make it insignificant.

Marty - the permits make it a cumbersome system and we do not get a true read of the impact

Councillor Johnson – can we make it a true pilot project now - meaning open it up to anyone with a Veterans plate and measure Sebastian – have had a few out-of-towners come in for the pass (they are eligible), if they assume they have free parking and come in to fight it, each case is adjudicated individually, disagreement on whether they would win or not

Dave – intent was never to be exclusive and drive a wedge between those who served

Councillor Johnson – HVC needs to be at GIC to share that information, ask staff to explain RCMP role in Peacekeeping and other missions because there is lack of understanding of RCMP role

Dave – Canada has not fought a war (legal definition) since World War II, since then either police actions, peacekeeping, (if the gov't declares war then all of their debts of serving military are covered)

Councillor Johnson – asked that staff work with Dave when preparing the next report

Action: Rebecca to provide contact information to Sebastian

Sebastian - doesn't think we've had issues, no red flags of Veterans plates being ticketed

Use social media, legions, city's website to get word out about the program

Councillor Pasuta – asked if there was any way for By-law officers to tally how many plates are in downtown over a period of time Sebastian – looked at BIAs as key areas that might attract people, walking beat officers are only in the BIA areas

Note: 44,316 veteran's plates issued across Ontario as of Nov 2014, plate issued to veteran, plate expires when veteran expires, any number of vehicles in the veterans name can have veteran's plates, plate is registered to the vehicle

## 4.3 Veterans Place at Gore Park - Security

Bob discussed changing camera locations, so area around enclaves would be projected better on-screen, at the most recent Downtown West Harbourfront Coordinating Committee meeting Inspector Worster did not report any issues at Veterans Place.

Update: Staff Recommendation Report went to Audit, Finance and Administration Committee on January 18.

The Facility Naming Sub-committee received a proposal to rename the Mohawk/Sanatorium Parkette, located at 260 Mohawk Road West, Hamilton, be renamed in memory of fallen soldier Sergeant Shawn Eades, who grew up in Hamilton. They asked for any comments from the Hamilton Veterans Committee.

The HVC has no concerns and supports the renaming of the parkette
