






Fig. 24 – Example of a Tweet (top right)

Questionnaire Results

- t√ ~ 40 49% can access a trail within 1km
- * Majority use trails for hiking, cycling, walking
- *t*/*t* ∼ 80% are satisfied with current state of trails (in person)
- ★ ~ 53% are satisfied with current state of trails (online)
