- Working group unique to Hamilton
- Regular meetings
- Platform to communicate, discuss and derive resolution for program issues.

- Domiciliary Hostel Program
 - Provincially is no longer recognized
 - (Former Domiciliary Hostel Program)
 - Per-diem: 50.00/day occupied bed
- ▶ Waitlist------
 - Started Jan 2, 2016; no expiry date
 - People are waiting months on end for housing
 - Current homes with subsidy at risk for closure
 - No subsidy intake at \$700/month or \$22,50
 /day. Inflexed of 44-46 clients without
 subsidy; July 2016
 - · Increase available vacancies
- Available Beds; on a negative trend
 - 2010 (1080 Beds with paid subsidy)
 - 2016 (740 Beds with paid subsidy)
 - 2016 (910 available subsidy beds)

- Housing with Related Supports
 - Housing with Related Supports Service Category , rolled out November 2014
 - Community Homelessness Prevention Imitative (CHPI) Guidelines of November 2012
- Implications:
 - Full Shelter: Temporary Housing; \$58 /day; high cost per stay
 - Adequate funding for full occupancy regardless of actual vacancy level
 - Longer Stay in Hospital: Expensive Housing; \$1000.00 / day
 - · Delay in discard process, reduces the availability of hospital beds
 - Streets of Hamilton: Option for people falling through the cracks.
 - Increase emergency room volume; people off their meds.
 - This data not is not captured on wait list report; visible on the street
- Systematic closures of Supportive Housing
 - Funding not adequate to sustain expected level of service
 - Single source of funding; Community Homelessness Prevention Imitative (CHPI)
 - Waitlist: Putting vulnerable people at risk staying homeless

Request

- 1. Recognition of the program "Supportive Housing Program"
 - As part of the Housing with Support Category; CHPI Guidelines of 2012
 - We are in compliance with all 40 CHPI guidelines rolled out in 2012
 - We are in compliance with all 8 New CHPI guidelines; Housing with Related Support 2014
 - We are asking the City to recognized and formally make the name change to align with current ministry documentation
- 2. Termination to the waitlist: Apply adequate funding.
- 3. Urgent and strategic plan to address:
 - CHPI funding allocation for Housing with Supports; increase slated for 2017
 - Apply annual inflation/ CPI adjustments to sustain and maintain standards
 - Secure sustainable funding to stop the erosion / closures of one of Hamilton's CORE
 Affordable Housing Program.
