PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVERS

WHAT IS A PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER?

- A Pedestrian Crossover is a new type of crossing where **BY LAW** drivers are required to stop for pedestrians intending to cross the road.
- Drivers must allow the pedestrian to cross the **FULL** width of the road before proceeding.

WHAT DOES A PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER LOOK LIKE?

A Pedestrian Crossover is identified with:

- Pavement markings
- Signs


A Pedestrian Crossover can be located at an:

- Intersection
- Mid-block
- Roundabout

Note: Some Pedestrian Crossovers will have additional illuminated overhead lights, signs and a pedestrian push button.

HOW TO USE A PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER

AS A DRIVER/CYCLIST:  

When approaching a **marked Pedestrian Crossover**:

- Pay attention to your surroundings.
- Watch for pedestrians who are intending to cross the road.
- Stop for pedestrians at the marked yield bar.
- Allow the pedestrian to **FULLY** cross the **ENTIRE** width of the road.
- Proceed when the road is clear.

AS A PEDESTRIAN: 

Always use caution and make sure the driver or cyclist has enough time to stop before stepping onto the road.

- Make sure drivers see you before you cross.
- Make eye contact with the driver/cyclist once they are stopped.
 - * If there is a push button at the crossing, make sure to press it and activate the flashing beacons.
- Begin crossing once you feel it is safe to do so.
