We've had several discussions about the proposed LRT at our monthly planning meetings. During our meeting on June 06 2016, 25 voting members of our planning team voted unanimously to publicly express our support for the LRT initiative.

Many residents in the Sherman Hub recognize that the Hamilton LRT project is a progressive move forward that supports our vision that "The Sherman Hub is a great place to live, work and raise a family." Although it's well understood that there will be disruptions and difficuties during the construction phase we believe resulting the benefits to our community and the greater Hamilton community will far outweigh those challenges. Sherman Hub residents are steadfastly known for their support of local business and this will continue throughout the construction of the LRT. Some of our Planning Team members are already actively engaging to plan ways to lend extra support to businesses along the LRT corridor during this time.

Here is a modest proposal that should please both the friends and foes of the LRT project:

For half a decade now, we have had plans and drawings for this new system. The crux of the argument can be reduced to the four blocks of King Street between Wellington and Mary. Drivers will state that this is a bottleneck that strangles through traffic even now. LRT planners insist that they can put two tracks of the LRT *plus* retain space for traffic *plus* have a lovable sidewalk *plus* have curb parking *plus* increase profits for business owners. If they can in fact do this, the whole LRT design will work. If not, the project must be scrapped or at least heavily redesigned.

We are told that it is easy to try out such new ideas by using cones, paint stripes and benches to alter traffic patterns on a trial basis at low cost. Hamilton has already done this with bus lanes, with conclusive results. So before we spend a dime more on what could be wasted plans, let's block off King Street to vehicular traffic which will then detour to...umm...Cannon Street, and let the buses alone occupy these four blocks.

An even better test would be to reduce the whole length of King/Queenston to two lanes for the length of the proposed route.

If the LRT design office has the courage of its convictions, they will want to prove their case at the earliest possible moment. If they resist this proposal, we need to get new planners who have more creative options, or be prepared to hand back the billion dollars before the downtown is strangled for generations to come.

I would like to suggest an alternative to the currently debated east-west LRT corridor

I feel very strongly that a north-south transit development on the west mountain makes a great deal more sense than the east-west King St. corridor. With a north-south-west LRT, all the folks now clogging up Beckett drive and the 403 coming downhill in their cars every morning and every evening would be given a fast (hopefully), classy (possibly) alternative to get to work at Mac, or the Hospital(s). It would greatly relieve these twice-daily bottlenecks.

And it could possibly make the Meadowlands more accessible by transit for folks living in the West end of Hamilton. It could also lay the groundwork for connections to Ancaster by transit, currently a very problematic and under-serviced area. I see many win-wins arising out of this option.

Other options could be considered for the east-west route: what about a dedicated bus lane on <u>the inside</u> of the King St. roadway with island for passengers to embark and disembark, like one would for trains...only it doesn't involve tearing up the road for tracks. This would be a realistic preparation for driverless vehicles, as I'm sure that is the next phase of development just around the corner.

I hope that "LRT" opponents, proponents, and funders, may be open to other ideas that better serve our community than the current LRT proposal on the table.

As a resident of Ward 7 in Hamilton, and relying solely upon public transit to manoeuvre around our city; I am horrified that some of our council members do not understand the importance of LRT to the continued growth and success of our city.

Let me tell you how my current commute goes. 5 days a week, I catch the Upper Gage or Upper Sherman bus, and connect with the Barton in order to travel across the city to my employer at Centre Mall. I leave an hour and 15 minutes before starting my shift at Staples, and I get there usually with 10 minutes to spare. Add the reverse trip, and I've lost two and a half hours each day commuting to and from my job.

Add on an extra 3 hours commute time each week for my volunteer involvement with two of our city's community orchestras, and we're now looking at 15.5 hours of my time spent commuting on public transit each week. I haven't even factored in my trips to local businesses for groceries or leisure and entertainment.

Just looking at timing alone, I would choose to take the LRT across the city to Ottawa Street, and walk to work from there. I would also utilize the service to have a quicker commute to the other places I need to frequent.

Further to the time issue is the issue of overcrowded busses having to leave passengers at bus stops because there is simply no more room on the bus. I've seen this mainly on our major cross-city routes: the King, B-Line and Barton. The LRT line would definitely ease the congestion I see every single day with our current bus only system.

I know that some of our counsellors have never set foot on the HSR for the purpose of commuting to and from work, like many of our hard working citizens, and I believe that if all of you were made to do so for a week, as a requirement of your position on city council; the LRT debate wouldn't be a debate at all.

Our city needs this, and there's funding being handed to us to make this happen. Please support our city by supporting LRT.


