6.1 Correspondence

MTO Cycling Network – The Provincial Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has initiated a study to define a province-wide cycling network. The study team has asked the City to provide the Hamilton cycling network, both existing and planned routes.

Cycling Connection at King St/ RHVP – A resident asked that this connection be addressed and was discussed at this meeting as item 6.5

Cycling Tourism in Hamilton – The committee was informed that tour groups are looking to offer new cycling excursions in Hamilton – including departures from Hamilton area GO stations.

LRT streetscape workshop – Linda and staff provided highlights of this LRT workshop, including accommodations for cycling.
