Vaccine Program Requirements

- 6 major program areas

Program Area 1: Immunization Record Assessment


 All children in child care centres and schools (more than 54,000 people yearly)



Program Area 2: Providing Immunizations

School and the community

19,000 students in 125 schools during



Program Area 3: Vaccine Inventory Management

- Vaccine cold chain 2-8°C at all times
- 22 publicly-funded vaccines
- Over \$11M in inventory in 2015



Program Area 4: AEFIs

- Investigations to determine if meet reporting criteria (~30 per year)
- Individualized recommendations for future immunization
- Provincial reporting

Program Area 6: Emergency Preparedness

 Able to rapidly redeploy staff to prevent or control the spread of vaccine preventable diseases

• E.g., Syrian newcomer health, Costco Hepatitis

Recommendations

- That the Vaccine Program service delivery be managed through reallocation of existing budget and FTE in Public Health Services
- That the Board of Health send a letter to the Ontario
 Minister of Health and Long-Term Care with copies to
 the Chief Medical Officer of Health and all Ontario
 Boards of Health to request adequate financial
 resources to fully deliver the Vaccine Program as
 described under the Ontario Public Health Standards
 and with a goal of increasing immunization levels in the
 community
