## Background Hamilton

- October 2016, Province published a "Review of the Ontario Municipal Board – Public Consultation Document". Comments due to Province - December 19, 2016
- City has provided comments on 3 occasions as part of other *Planning Act* Reform Initiatives (PED14004, PED15093 and PED16152) on OMB Reform
- Regional Planning Commissioners of Ontario and other municipalities providing similar comments

- Alternative dispute resolution and fewer hearings

## OMB jurisdiction and powers

Restrictions on OP and OPA appeals

 Sending new information back to Council prior to an OMB hearing

 Reviewing Council decisions on a standard of "reasonableness"



#### Citizen participation and local perspective

 Improving the procedures so the public can more easily understand and have access to the process

 Better information from OMB on its website (e.g more timely posting of decisions with attachments, better information on the Citizen's Liaison Office)

## Clear and predictable decision making

Improve consistency of decisions

Multi-member panels, differing disciplines



#### Modern procedures and faster decisions

For efficiency and cost, greatest opportunity for change

- Rethink pre-hearing rules and processes, examples:
  - Eliminate procedural orders and issues lists, instead use standard set of rules and information exchange practices
  - Shorten time between filing of appeal and first hearing event
  - Increase hearings in writing where appropriate

Improve availability of mediators

Reduce pre-mediation filing requirements

Not make mediation "required"

Early neutral evaluation

 Eliminate appeal for non-decision where decision imminent
