
 2011 demolition of 30 King Street East

 City January 2013 issuance of demolition permits for 18-28 King Street East

Designated - Part IV Ontario Heritage Act

- December 13, 2013 Notices of Intention to Designate for 18–22 and 24 and 28 King Street East
- Appealed January 2014
- Designation stands pending outcome of hearing by Conservation Review Board or settlement agreement between City and appellant




Gore Park & King Street East Streetscape











B. 6.1.7.6. The City / Council may require ... that heritage properties are retained on-site and incorporated, used or adaptively re-used as appropriate

from Downtown Hamilton Secondary Plan

- B. 6.1.7.8. Where alterations are proposed to the heritage buildings, the **following principles shall be followed**:
 - Maintain the basic relations to the horizontal divisions of the building;
 - b. Maintain original façade components and materials wherever possible;
 - c. Replicate the original parts and materials where possible or substitute with similar materials and colours; and,
 - d. Remove elements that are not part of the original design and / or hide the original design, for example signage, siding or root (sic) treatments."


