Population Growth per Communities - Census 2016

1. Lower Hamilton -2%
2. Upper Hamilton 0.98%
3. Stoney Creek 6% (mostly by the lakefront)
4. Glanbrook/Binbrook 25%
5. Ancaster 9%
6. Dundas -2.5%
7. Flamborough 6%
8. Map included showing the growth area in dark brown

2016 Census Data shows there is no valid support for LRT.

1. All the growth is in the suburbs
2. Majority of Homes being sold in Ward 2, 3 and 4 are purchased by Torontonians
3. They are looking for an easy commute
4. This makes these Wards a Bedroom Community
5. Bedroom community will not use LRT
6. Lower Hamilton is declining in population

Using these current statistics:

1. Population Growth from 2011 to 2016 is 3% (all in the suburbs)
2. Lower City -2% (lower city in decline)
3. Census Data included

Based on above data the growth is in the suburbs, which will have no use for the LRT

What facilitates population growth?

1. Jobs
2. We have all these brown fields at the north of the city
3. Transportation has to be flexible, environmentally friendly buses
4. They are not noisy
5. They have ability to change the lights, giving it right of way
6. This would help create a positive future for the whole city

We were supposed to get 600 million for transit and infrastructure and instead we get LRT that is most destructive path for this city.

1. It will cripple Hamilton
2. The suburbs have no benefit
3. It will punish our senior citizens with heavy burden to get to the LRT stops providing barely any access
4. It will destroy all the businesses and decimate King Street
5. We will not have money for infrastructure
6. There is an urgent need to address our crumbling infrastructure
7. We will be haemorrhaging money to subsidize LRT without sufficient ridership to cover the cost
8. Currently, the only profitable line for the HSR is the Beeline 10 Bus Route – the LRT eliminates the Beeline and the HSR will require even more subsidy from the city
9. LRT is not flexible, where as smart buses can be added or removed based on need
10. In 2016 the ridership decreased by approximately 700,000

McMaster University

1. There is large commute of their students from various cities using GO buses
2. Full time students already have HSR Bus pass included in their tuition

One of Hamilton's politicians made a comment to a businessman:

1. "Businesses come and go."
2. It is not about businesses rather people's livelihood, some businesses have been there for decades
3. Businesses employ citizens of this city – we certainly do not need to add to our unemployment rate
4. Businesses are already banding together and will likely proceed with a class action suit should the LRT proceed.

We are giving up our street to Metrolinx

1. Once we give them our street
2. We no longer have control over our King Street
3. All decisions regarding changes to King street belong to Metrolinx

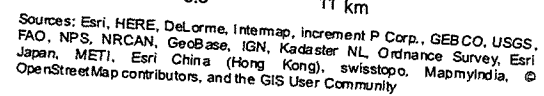
In closing I would like to ask all of you deciding on this destructive course for the City of Hamilton
