#### Four Reasons to say NO - (2) Technically Wrong

- 1. The existing by-law avoids conflicts between neighbours. That is why it was originally enacted. **The proposed by-law will create conflicts** between neighbours.
- 2. The proposed by-law is seriously wrong technically.
  - 60db measured <u>at property line</u> means 60 db in adjacent bedrooms.
  - MOE standard is 50 db measured at the window of the bedroom.



#### Four Reasons to say No! - (3) Unenforceable + Unfair

- 1. The existing by-law avoids conflicts between neighbours. That is why it was originally enacted. The proposed by-law will create conflicts between neighbours.
- 2. The proposed by-law is seriously wrong technically.
- 3. Proposed by-law will not be enforced. Neighbours will not be notified
  - The City's track record is poor enforcement
  - No budget exists for real enforcement
  - Neighbours are not notified of permit applications
  - By-Law curtails neighbours common law rights



### Four Reasons to Say No! – (4) Unnecessary

- The existing by-law avoids conflicts between neighbours. That is why it was originally enacted. The proposed by-law will create conflicts between neighbours.
- 2. The proposed by-law is seriously wrong technically.
- 3. Proposed by-law will not be enforced. Neighbours will not be notified

#### 4. The Proposed By-Law is Unnecessary:

Any restaurant wanting to have live music on its patio can today apply for a minor variance on notice to its neighbours.
