- (v) Existing capacity, resource and funding challenges,
- (vi) Request for continued consultation with local Public Health Units and Boards of Health in the development of new policies, protocols, guidance documents and annual service plan templates referenced in the new Standards, and
- (vii) Request for ongoing communication and consultation to support broader health system transformation including the Expert Panel on Public Health, the Public Health Work Stream and the new Accountability Framework.
