# 5. **PRESENTATIONS**

## 5.1 DARTS Service Update by Mark Mindorff & Ron Trajano

 Ron Trajano provided an overview of DARTS' 2016 statistics which included the budget, demographics of passengers, issues that affect service, peak travel times, and the composition of DARTS fleet

#### Some questions for DARTS presenters:

Q. What is the number/percentage of passengers who go to work? A. There is not a significant number of passengers who use DARTS to go to work and therefore it was not captured.

Q. Will DARTS have a newsletter to communicate updates, changes, etc. in service?

A. Accessible Transportation Services (ATS) communicates with the passengers, via newsletters and communiques.

Q. Do service demands fluctuate according to seasons?

A. January to June and September to November are busy months whereas service demands decrease in the summer because of a decrease in programming.

Q. What kind of training do drivers undergo?

A. There is a two-week training program in which newly hired drivers are trained by existing drivers and supervisors. Some of

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the requirements for drivers are that they are empathetic and have knowledge of the city.

Q. Is there a restriction on DARTS drivers to communicate with passengers?

A. All complaints go to the City of Hamilton, ATS handles customer service inquiries, and DARTS handles reservations/scheduling.

Q. According to the ATS Performance Report, there were over 15,000 trips denied in 2016. How was this number calculated and does this include subscription trips?

A. This number is based on waitlisted trips that were not fulfilled and does not include subscription trips. The number of trip denials plus the estimated growth for the following year determine the growth rate in service demands. Mark Mindorff will find out how the number of trip denials is calculated by the ATS.

Q. Why were call return services cancelled?

A. We need to serve as many passengers as possible, need to ensure shortest travel routes/times, and maintain shorter waitlists.

Q. Did DARTS receive any assistance to offset the decrease in ridership due to lower/no HSR fares for persons 55 and over?

A. No we did not.

Q. The SAC Getting Around Hamilton Working Group and the ACPD Transportation Working Group are planning to amalgamate (if approved by both committees). Are there any issues that this working group should focus on?

A. The Working Group should provide input and ideas on what DARTS can do differently to provide the best service possible.

Q. How does DARTS handle emergencies, for example inclement weather?

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A. Depending on the location and if a driver can make it there in time, drivers may swap rides if one is running late. In the case that poor weather conditions are predicted, such as a snow storm, a snow day will be implemented in which all rides will be cancelled; announcements will be posted on the DARTS website and on radio stations.

Comment: The increase of HSR and DARTS fares for seniors may further isolate seniors if they cannot afford to pay for these increases.

Q. How many Pro-Master vans does DARTS have?

A. DARTS currently has seven Pro-Master vans, which are being enhanced. If Council approves the remaining 14 Pro-Master vans, DARTS will have 21 in total.

Q. What impacts service the most, refusals or cancelations?

A. No shows impact service the most. Advanced cancelations impact service the least because they are the most cost efficient.

Q. Is there any way someone can apply for DARTS in advance, for example someone with deteriorating eye sight?

A. Unsure about how to establish eligibility for DARTS in advance; inquiries should be made to the City of Hamilton.

Q. Is there a way to cancel subscription rides more than two weeks in advance?

A. Individuals wanting to cancel subscription rides more than two weeks in advance must contact ATS and make the request.

**Part A:** The Seniors Advisory Committee's Getting Around Hamilton Working Group recommends that the Seniors Advisory Committee not endorse Councillor Tom Jackson's request to ask Council to not increase the Hamilton Street Railway's (HSR) senior fares for 2017 and recommends that the HSR continue to increase senior fares as already established.

## 8.2 Update from Councillor Tom Jackson

- Councillor Jackson reported that there is a petition signed by tenants who would like to keep DARTS in place. The petition was submitted by the tenants residing at the apartment building located at 801 Upper Gage in Ward 6
- On March 23, Council will vote on the future of DARTS with the following three options: 1) To keep DARTS as is with some improvements, 2) Move DARTS under HSR, or 3) Put services out to tender and issue a request for proposals
- The Age Friendly City Initiative has been approved for \$30,000 as an enhancement to offset costs and will be part of the Community Services budget going forward.
- Councillor Jackson also shared information regarding the huge budget shortfall that the city is experiencing this year,
- Council if faced with a 4.4% tax increase however City Council is trying to reduce this to 2.8%
- there has been some staff layoffs so far
