- (a) That the technical and housekeeping changes to the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054, Town of Ancaster Tree Protection By-law No. 2000-118, Town of Dundas Tree Protection By-law No. 4513-99, and City of Stoney Creek Tree By-law No. 4401-96, detailed in the proposed amending By-law attached as Appendix "A" to Report PED17084 be approved; and,
- (b) That the amending By-law attached as Appendix "A" to Report PED17084, which has been prepared in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor be enacted by Council.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

By-law amendments are occasionally required, to correct minor errors, and as part of continuous improvement efforts, for the most efficient and effective by-laws. Report PED17084 recommends:

 amending the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054 to up-date and clarify the meaning of the tree destruction restrictions in Section 3; SUBJECT: Housekeeping Amendment to the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054, Town of Ancaster Tree Protection By-law No. 2000-118, Town of Dundas Tree Protection By-law No. 4513-99, and City of Stoney Creek Tree By-law No. 4401-96 (PED17084) (City Wide) - Page 2 of 3

 updating and harmonizing the general penalty provisions of all the City of Hamilton Tree By-laws.

#### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The current wording of the tree destruction restrictions in Section 3 of the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054 does not clearly set out the four possible offences and has made enforcement problematic.

## **RELEVANT CONSULTATION**

Legal Services was consulted in the preparation of this Report and the draft amending By-law attached as Appendix "A" to Report PED17084.

#### ANALYSIS AND RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

As part of continuous improvement efforts, staff work to improve enforcement activities, including updating various by-laws to address specific municipal needs identified by Council, committees, staff, public, and the courts. In addition to continuous improvement efforts, by-laws require changes over time to align with changes to legislation, improved processes and to correct obsolete or imprecise language while maintaining the by-laws' original intent and their effectiveness.

The changes recommended in this Report are minor in nature, and do not in any way deviate from the by-laws' intent as originally approved and enacted by Council. To remedy the incongruity identified in the tree destruction restrictions under Section 3 of the current Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054, the amending By-law, attached as Appendix "A" to Report PED17084, makes clear that there are four separate offences which the current

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language fails to do. In addition, the penalty provisions of the Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054, relies on the Forestry Act, which no longer applies.

Staff determined the penalty provisions are inconsistent and out-of-date in the following by-laws which protect trees and woodlands:

- Regional Municipality of Hamilton-Wentworth Woodland Conservation By-law No. R00-054;
- Town of Ancaster Tree Protection By-law No. 2000-118;
- Town of Dundas Tree Protection By-law No. 4513-99;
- City of Stoney Creek Tree By-law No. 4401-96.

The amendments in Appendix "A" to Report PED17084 are consistent with the recently enacted Hamilton Urban Woodland Conservation By-law and Public Tree Protection By-law, thereby harmonizing the penalty provisions city-wide.
