5. PRESENTATIONS

5.1 Community Profile Report March 2017 – by Jeanne Mayo, SAC and Sara Mayo, Social Planning and Research Council

- J. Mayo presented the summary of the 2016 Community Progress Report
- Points were brought forward: need for more benches at bus stops and where benches are not located in bus shelters, benches need to be covered
- S. Mayo provided an overview of the Age Friendly Hamilton Report, March 2017: i) Accessible inclusive environment, ii) Physical environments, and iii) Age friendly leadership

Discussion Points

1) Missing from the data

- Racialized and ethno-cultural population are absent from the data.
- S. Mayo said that it is in the larger report. We still need the information for planning purposes and not all of this data is available. S. Mayo agreed that the percentage of immigrants coming to Hamilton has decreased. The City of Hamilton is aware and has put in place the Global Hamilton initiative and the Hamilton Immigration Partnership Council

2) Affordable Housing

 Concerned at the cost of affordable seniors housing – there is an increase in rental costs. What is being done?

3) Are iPad and touch screen programs accessible?

• Are there tactile or Braille letting people who are visually impaired know that the benches are there?

4) Are there particular programs with the Police to educate seniors about how to deal with fraud or issues that put them at risk?

• L. Maychak noted that the HPS has numerous programs in place to assist seniors

5.2 Snow Angels - Deb Clinton and Rikki Frith Neighbourhood Action Strategy

- Deb Clinton provided an overview of the Snow Angels Program, 2017 statistics, as well as the strengths, values, and challenges of the program
- D. Clinton asked the Committee for feedback and input on the program

Some Questions and Comments from the Committee:

Q. Can volunteers get bus tickets to get to other wards?

A. Yes. We are open to that, however, we try to match within wards.

Q. What is the Snow Angels connection to Neighbourhood Committees?

Answer:

- It was noted that the cost to get vulnerable security checks by RCMP and/or the HPS is heavy
- It is important to advise Neighbourhood Committees in the fall regarding the Snow Angels programs
- The Snow Angels Program does advise volunteers to not have contact with the home owner/renter but cannot stop interaction if the senior initiates contact
- Volunteers are told not to use the homeowner/renter's snow blower/snow equipment due to the risk involved
- Councillor Jackson noted that the program is very important and needed; the City of Hamilton has put aside \$200,000 to keep this program going
- A volunteer luncheon is provided each year to show appreciation to the volunteers and to say thank you
- Consider charging minimal fee for those who can afford it, e.g. \$25-\$30/month
- Can get the Small Business Enterprise Centre to get an entrepreneur who could be employed to assist with some of the ploughing

8. ANNOUNCEMENTS/INFORMATION SHARING

8.1 Update from Councillor T. Jackson – including (1) Seniors 2017 HSR Fare AND (2) DARTS AND (3) Age Friendly City Budget Updates

- Two new members were appointed to the Seniors Advisory Committee
- March 3, 2017 Seniors 2017 HSR fare Council deferred third year strategy to freeze all fares on HSR; no seniors increase

- DARTS new three-year contract until June 2020 DARTS drivers were praised by many
- Council will now have direct contact with DARTS Executive Director; New Pro-vans will also be purchased
- \$30,000 approved for Age Friendly budget
- \$1,500 grant to the Seniors Advisory Committee approved

8.2 Update from Councillor B. Johnson

- Fifty million passed at Council; 20 million being invested into poverty reduction and the remaining 30 million invested into housing
- Three million each year to repair and replace existing housing up to proper standards
- Budgets begins November and ends in April. This issues was presented and passed April 6, 2017
- Based on where you live, i.e. ward

- There are thirty-five nominations the number of diverse nominations has increased
- Tickets are available at Municipal Service Centres and Sackville
