4.1 Parking for Veterans in Hamilton

Minister will meet with HVC, possibly lunch to learn the highlights of what this committee is, possibly visit Veterans Place at Gore Park. Note: Re-enactment of the Battle of Stoney Creek weekend. Minister may like to attend.

~ Will connect with other local veteran and military groups to crosspromote events

~ Public page open to anyone

~ No comments section

~ No overt engagement or solicitation to outside agencies

~ All information on the page (description, mandate, etc.) will mirror what is found on the city website for our group

5.1 Decoration Day–Woodland Cemetery–Sunday, June 11, 2017

Due to the Picnic on the Bridge event happening on the High Level Bridge Sunday, June 11 the HVC agreed to move the Decoration Day ceremony to Eastlawn Cemetery this year. Members should use their contacts now to get the word out of the change of location. Staff will ask our Communications team to ensure media releases go out with the change of location. Brydie will notify cemetery, HSR and other participants. The program will be reviewed at the May 23rd meeting.

Note: It was agreed by the committee that the Senior Veteran on the Hamilton Veterans Committee should always be offered the honour of of reciting the Act of Remembrance.

5.2 Dieppe Memorial – Saturday, August 19, 2017

Marko to be invited to go to the initial planning meeting with Dieppe committee and City staff. Through his contacts in the King's Own Cavalry Regiment a suggestion was made that the Calgary Unit be invited to participate in the Dieppe Memorial Ceremony. They would send troops at their expense.

May want to reach out to King's Own Cavalry before the initial planning meeting as that may be too late to make arrangements. Brydie to follow-up.

5.3 Remembrance Day

Garrison Parade – Saturday, November 11, 2017 City Service – Saturday, November 11, 2017

In depth planning for Remembrance Day will begin after Decoration Day in June. General notes – the ceremony and Garrison Parade will both take place on November 11 this year as it is a Saturday. The diversity and youth participation in the ceremony will continue moving forward.

Hamilton Volunteer Cavalry Unit – participation in Parade

Guest: Mr. Edward Penner

The Hamilton Volunteer Cavalry Unit has a membership of 3 riders, all are serving Military, Mr. Penner is a police officer in Hamilton, for 6 years is currently a mounted officer.

Offering to be a resource for Veterans Remembrance Events, endeavouring to bring the history of the Canadian Mounted Rifles to the forefront

Participated last year in the Parade, motto is Respect, Honour and Remember, members are in the Canadian Armed Forces, they are not reenactors, intention is never to take away from the actual event, they are about education, do demonstration rides, they are a non-profit organization and fully insured with the City of Hamilton named as a protected party, they have a good partnership with Hamilton Military Museum and the Argylls

The HVC has no objection to their participation in the service in 2017.

Paul Stevenson – expressed his objection to the diversity of the 2016 Remembrance Day ceremony, felt that 2016 ceremony was very political, asked how someone is invited to be part of the ceremony as he would like an opportunity to share his Scottish heritage

Chair responded, HVC will discuss his concerns, intent was to become inclusive as HVC and City have been asked for many years to be more inclusive as the ceremony has been very Christian centric, committee will discuss offering guidelines to those that are asked to speak, it is not a religious ceremony with military aspects but rather a military ceremony with religious aspects, asked Mr. Stevenson to put in his request to speak through staff to be considered during planning.

Mr. Stevenson left the meeting.

Chair reminded the HVC that Remembrance Day is a ceremony to honour our Veterans.

Staff suggested the HVC needs to be prepared for more of the same as they continue to be diverse and inclusive.

Develop a script so HVC and staff are all saying the same thing.

Develop guidelines for speakers to ensure religion does not enter in to remarks made at any Veterans memorial ceremony

Need to stay the course, cannot control the crowd, those looking for divisiveness will find it, those looking for inclusivity will find it.
