- 250 lane km of road rehabilitation
- 60 lane km of road replacement
- Completion:
  - Upper Red Hill Valley Parkway
  - Construction of Avonsyde Blvd
- Widening / urbanization of:
  - Rymal Road East from Dartnall Rd to Fletcher Rd
  - Highway 56 in Binbrook, Upper Sherman & Dartnall Rd

#### **Traffic Operations & Engineering**

- 590 traffic light in the City of Hamilton
- 6,500 lane km of pavement markings



- New Public Works Driver Safety and Compliance Manual
  - reduced the City's overall CVOR rating from 88.8 to 49.4 end of 2016
- Traffic Management Centre Constructed
- Ongoing Asset Preservation Neighbourhood Resurfacing (i.e. Delta East)
- Dash Cam pilot and full installation (i.e. waste collection vehicles)
- Real Time Computer (RTC) sidewalk inspection processed introduced



#### **Getting People Moving - Transit**

- Focus on transit by approving the Ten Year Local Transit Strategy.
   This strategy addresses:
  - Current system deficiencies
  - Updated service standards and the alignment of service to meet them
  - Accommodating future growth
  - Additional bus service on the BLAST corridors
  - Focus on customer experience





#### **Getting People Moving - Transit**

- Purchased and put into service:
  - 25 expansion buses
  - 18 replacement buses
  - up fitted total of 67 buses
  - 46 new transit shelters
- AODA requirements completed
- Mohawk College Terminal Completion
- ATS service review achieved \$1 million savings while increasing service by 60,000 trips





#### **Light Rail Transit - LRT**

- Signing of Memorandum of Agreement with Metrolinx
- Spring and Fall engagement with property owners and tenants along LRT corridor by Community Connectors
- Completion of first set of Public Information Centres as part of the Transit Project Assessment Process (TPAP)

#### **Facilities**

- 10 Year Facilities Life-Cycle Renewal & New Construction Strategy
  - Address the aging infrastructure and the funding shortfall for the life-cycle renewal of 500+ city-owned facilities.
- Completed conceptual design for the new Gage Park Tropical House
- Expansion of Griffin House Historic site
- Upgrades to Ancaster's Heritage Green Park
- Partnership with HCA to restore Ancaster Hermitage
- Completion of the Maplevale pump station capacity upgrades

Hamilton is environmentally sustainable with a healthy balance of natural and urban spaces.

- Landfilled 145,000 tonnes of waste at the Glanbrook Landfill and diverted 94,000 tonnes waste in 2016
- 40 lights installed completely off the grid on the Mountain Brow. The largest solar off-grid street light installation completed in Canada
- \$58 million in cumulative energy savings and avoided costs (2006-2016)
- Implemented the first "Beautiful Alleyways" neighbourhood clean up event
- Provides residents free compost and woodchips



- Planted 16,800 trees. 10,000 funded and planted as part of Forest Ontario's 50
   Million Trees program (2016)
- Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) Management Plan
  - Completed implementation of year 4 of 10 year plan
  - 7141 trees removed in 2015 & 2016
  - To date (2013 2016) removed 12077
- Greening of HSR Fleet
  - CNG conversion: Increase from 23.5% of fleet in 2015 to 33% in 2016
  - CNG buses represent 18% reduction in carbon emissions (compared to diesel)







# Healthy & Safe Communities Homelessness & Poverty Reduction

#### Implementation of:

#### **Poverty Reduction Strategy**

 The program's goal is to achieve a measurable impact in the Hamilton community.

#### **Neighbourhood Action Strategy**


- Focused on helping neighbourhoods be great places to live, work, play and learn.
- Participated in a coordinated effort to measure homelessness across Canada the 20,000 Point-in-Time (PiT) Count survey.
- Relocated 39 individuals from closed, unsubsidized Residential Care Facilities to stable, appropriate housing.



#### **Social Services**

- Continued to assist individuals to remain in secure housing through the Housing Stability act.
- Deliver an affordable housing benefit program for survivors of domestic violence.
- Completed Social Assistance Management System (SAMS) stabilization.
- Committed \$1.5M tax supported capital funding to return or preserve 82 social housing units for occupancy and address health and safety concerns impacting 468 units.
- Allocated \$11.6M from the 2016 Social Infrastructure Fund (SIF) for capital repairs in Hamilton's social housing stock.
- Received approval for one project under the Investment in Affordable Housing Extension Program (IAH-E) for a total of \$5.5M.
