Please accept this submission from MasonryWorx respecting the proposed new Valley Park Branch Library.

MasonryWorx is Ontario's professional association representing the brick, block and stone industry. This letter is not intended to be part of a procurement process and is not a submission or a response to a request for proposals; we are not a contractor and are not bidding on any project.

Instead, in our capacity as citizens and members of the business community within Ontario and the GTHA, we wish to voice our support for the construction of the new library branch. Major infrastructure projects such as libraries become local centrepieces which define neighbourhoods for generations. They help build tomorrow's heritage communities, today.

A municipality's sense of place comes from its distinct architectural character. Many of Ontario's most notable surviving heritage buildings are masonry structures. These long-lasting, resilient buildings become more than just buildings – they are local landmarks.
