THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WERE REFERRED TO COUNCIL FOR CONSIDERATION:

1. Improving Health By Design in the Greater Toronto-Hamilton Area (BOH14014(b)) (Item 5.1)

That Report BOH14014(b) respecting Improving Health By Design in the Greater Toronto-Hamilton Area, be received.

2. Bill C-37 and Supervised Injection Sites (BOH17021) (Item 5.2)

- 4. Stock Epinephrine Auto Injector Expansion in Restaurants (BOH13040(c)) (Item 7.1)
 - (a) That a volunteer-based Stock Epinephrine Auto Injector Program be developed and implemented to facilitate the access to and training on the use of stock epinephrine auto-injectors by up to 50 restaurants in the City of Hamilton under the following conditions:

- (i) That participating restaurants bear the cost of and be responsible for the maintenance of the epinephrine auto-injectors on their premises;
- (ii) That Food Allergy Canada provide in-kind training;
- (iii) That McMaster University provide in-kind evaluation;
- (iv) That PHS and Paramedic Services staff provide administrative support through existing resources;
- (v) That participating restaurants sign an agreement promising on-going training of new staff;
- (vi) That City staff will not be involved in the monitoring of the restaurants for compliance;
- (vii) That a minimum of six participants, representing six different restaurant chains, be registered with interest gauged by an online survey developed by McMaster University; and
- (b) That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to sign agreements with Food Allergy Canada, McMaster University and participating restaurants, and any ancillary documents, with content acceptable to the Medical Officer of Health and in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.
- 5. Food Strategy Implementation Process for Priority Action 1 (BOH13001(e)) (City Wide) (Item 8.1)

That the Food Initiatives Criteria Process and Checklist for Funding Requests, attached as Appendix "A" to Report BOH13001(e), be approved.

6. Review of Heart & Stroke Position Statement on Sugar, Heart Disease and Stroke (BOH17022) (Item 8.2)

- (a) That Review of the Potential Municipal Actions to Reduce Sugary Drink Consumption Proposed by Heart and Stroke Foundation of Canada and Diabetes Canada, attached as Appendix "A", be received;
- (b) That Public Health Services' staff contribute to City food and beverage procurement discussions and participate in:
 - (i) The development of future Requests for Proposal with clear language about expectations relating to sugary drinks, and
 - (ii) The review of significant food and beverage contracts, to ensure that healthy choices are available;

- (c) That Public Health Services further define and reduce sugary drinks in the next revision of the Corporate Healthy Food and Beverage Policy(Human Resources, Health, Safety & Wellness, Policy HR-41-11);
- (d) That Public Health Services and Recreation staff work together to investigate the feasibility of creating healthy choices guidelines in recreation facilities that:
 - (i) Aim to reduce sugary drinks and increase healthy options within vending machines and over-the-counter food service locations, and
 - (ii) Address food and drink advertising, promotion and display with a focus on healthy options;
- (e) That staff within Public Works Department include water drinking fountains as an option during the public consultation and conceptual design phases of new park developments;
- (f) That the Board of Health send letters to Honourable Kathleen Wynne (Premier of Ontario), Honourable Charles Sousa (Provincial Minister of Finance), Honourable Dr. Eric Hoskins (Provincial Minister of Health and Long-term Care), Honourable Jane Philpott (Federal Health Minister), and Honourable Senator Nancy Greene Raine in support of the following provincial and federal legislation:
 - (i) Bill C-313, National Strategy on Advertising to Children Act, which calls for the development and implementation of a national strategy on advertising to children and amendments to the Broadcasting Act,
 - (ii) Bill S-228,an Act to amend the Food and Drugs Act, which aims to prohibit the marketing of food and beverages to children under 13, and
 - (iii) Provincial taxation of sugary drinks, with the monies collected going to health promotion efforts.
