RECOMMENDATIONS

- (a) That City of Hamilton apply to the Province of Ontario to become a member of the Ontario Geospatial Data Exchange ("OGDE");
- (b) That City of Hamilton enter into a Data License Agreement, the form of which is prescribed by the Province of Ontario, whereby City of Hamilton can license its fully-owned digital geographic data to other members of the Ontario Geospatial Data Exchange ("OGDE");
- (c) That City of Hamilton enter into a Licensor Agency Agreement with the Minister of Natural Resources of the Province of Ontario ("OMNR"), whereby OMNR would act as City of Hamilton's non-exclusive agent to license and distribute City of Hamilton fully-owned digital geographic data to other OGDE members pursuant to the Data License Agreement referenced in Recommendation (b) of this Report No. FCS17068;
- (d) That the General Manager of Finance and Corporate Services Department be directed to execute on behalf of the City of Hamilton the Data License Agreement and the Licensor Agency Agreement, referenced in Recommendations (b) and (c) of this Report No. FCS17068 respectively, and all necessary ancillary documents, with content of said Agreements and ancillary documents

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satisfactory to the General Manager of Finance and Corporate Services, and the form of said Agreements and ancillary documents in a form satisfactory to the City Solicitor.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Digital data sets, fully-owned created and maintained by City of Hamilton are used by City of Hamilton staff to support City of Hamilton's corporate programs and services. For similar purposes, the Province of Ontario and a number of other Publicly Funded Organizations ("**PFOs**)", including the Hamilton Conservation create, maintain and use digital data sets. External organizations often request that City of Hamilton license its digital data, and City of Hamilton would benefit from using the digital data sets shared by the Province of Ontario and PFOs.

Land Information Ontario is a Provincial Department that maintains a data warehouse with more than 300 data sets that include geographic information. Land Information Ontario works with partners across the Province to create and maintain Provincial level data. In order for Hamilton to share data with the Province and other PFO's it is necessary for Hamilton to enter into the Ontario Data Exchange Data License Agreement with the Province of Ontario.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The Province of Ontario, through Land Information Ontario (LIO) maintains a data warehouse of over 300 data sets that include geographic information on Ontario's:

- Road network;
- Trails;
- Wetlands:
- · Lakes, rivers and streams;
- Parks and protected area;

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- Soil types;
- · Heritage sites;
- Airports;
- Official names; and,
- Municipal boundaries.

PFO's can easily share non-confidential geographic data with other organizations by becoming a member of the Ontario Geospatial Data Exchange (OGDE). Members can order data directly from the LIO warehouse. This information is gathered from a number of PFO's such as:

- Municipal, Provincial or Federal Governments;
- Conservation Authorities;
- Public Health Units:
- Non-profit organizations;
- · Colleges and universities; and,
- Public utilities.

The City would benefit by becoming an OGDE member by enabling the City to enhance its existing data sets for Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and mapping applications.

The City currently has a Data Dissemination Policy approved through report FCS15064, however, in this case the Province requires members to agree to the LIO agreement.

ANALYSIS AND RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION

The City gathers a great deal of geographical data with the associated attributes. Becoming a member of the OGDE program would allow for this sharing of information.

There are many GIS layers and datasets available through LIO that would be of major benefit to various City Departments.
